- Diagnosis will be determined

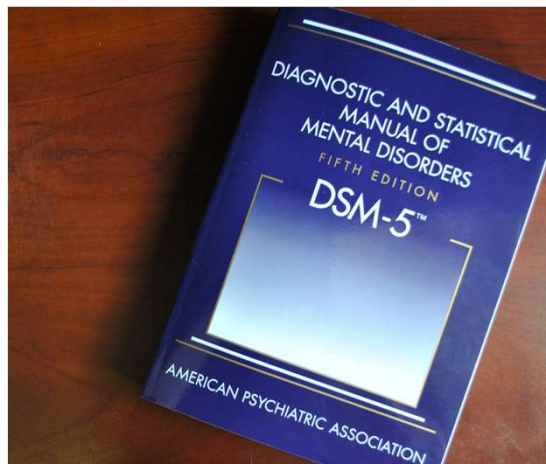
IV. Conclusions
