### HIGH SCHOOL TRUSTEES.

A meeting of the high school trustees and principals of the Utah county schools met with County Superintendent Eggertsen Saturday. Satisfaction with the high school work, and general interest in the movement were reported from all the districts. The senti-

ment was unanimously in favor of the third year, but some districts felt unable to take up the work at once. It was decided to follow in a general way the high school course prepared by the state university; the sentiment against too many elections was pronounced. Superintendent Eggertsen directed that the principals of high schools must have a high school diploma.

The sentiment in reference to supervisors teaching was that they be not required to teach more than two hours a day.
