The above listed expenditures does not provide for a bridge across the river or the proposed attendants house. Without these you will see that the cost will amount to \$606.53 more than the amount available from the State. To balance this there should be according to Contract some money coming from the Utah Power and Light Company. Again, there is included in the above expenditures, paid by us, the cost of the transmission line part way from the Plant to the Utah Power and Light Company's Salt Lake Line amounting, according to Prof. Jensen's statement, to about \$500.00. I notice by the General State Appropriation bill an appropriation of \$10,000.00 to the State Board of Examiners for the purpose of transmitting electricity to the other Institutions. Should not the amount of the cost of building this line be refunded to us from this appropriation?
