Herein are the victors. In our trophy case lies the Intermountain Junior College Conference football trophy. It is the result of long hours on the practice field, of sweat and toil.

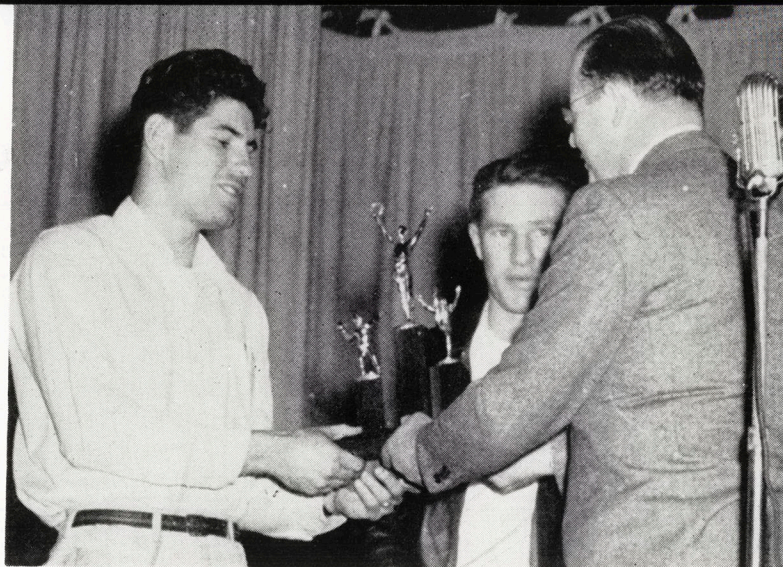
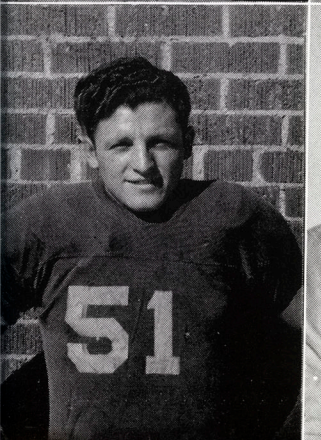
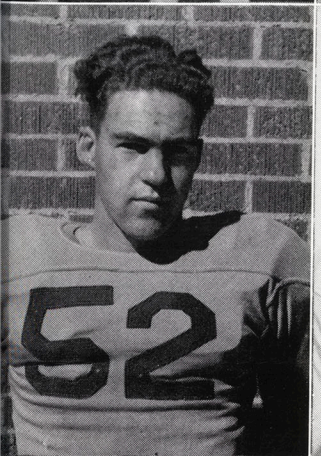
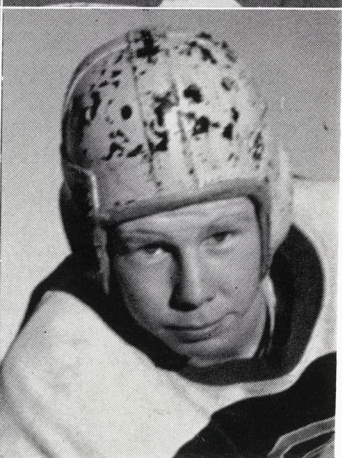
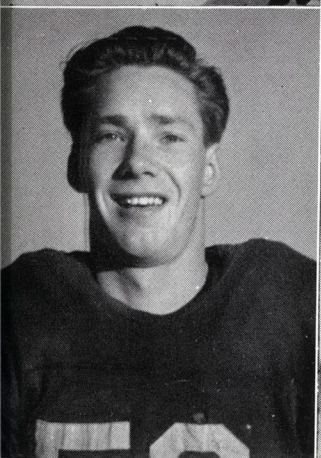
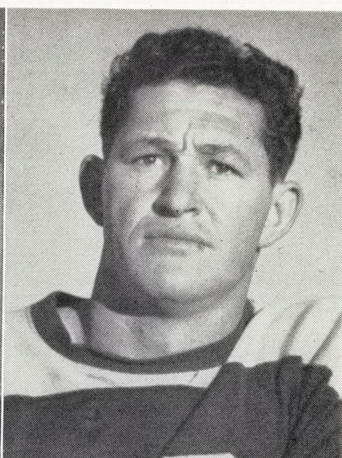

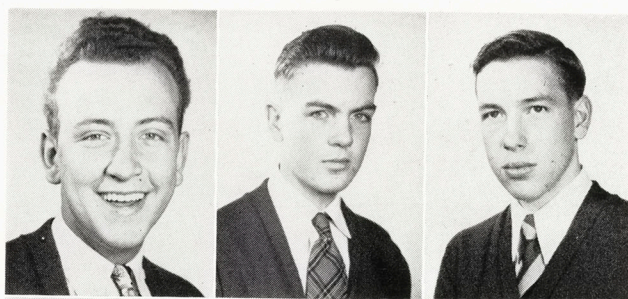
Senate Club

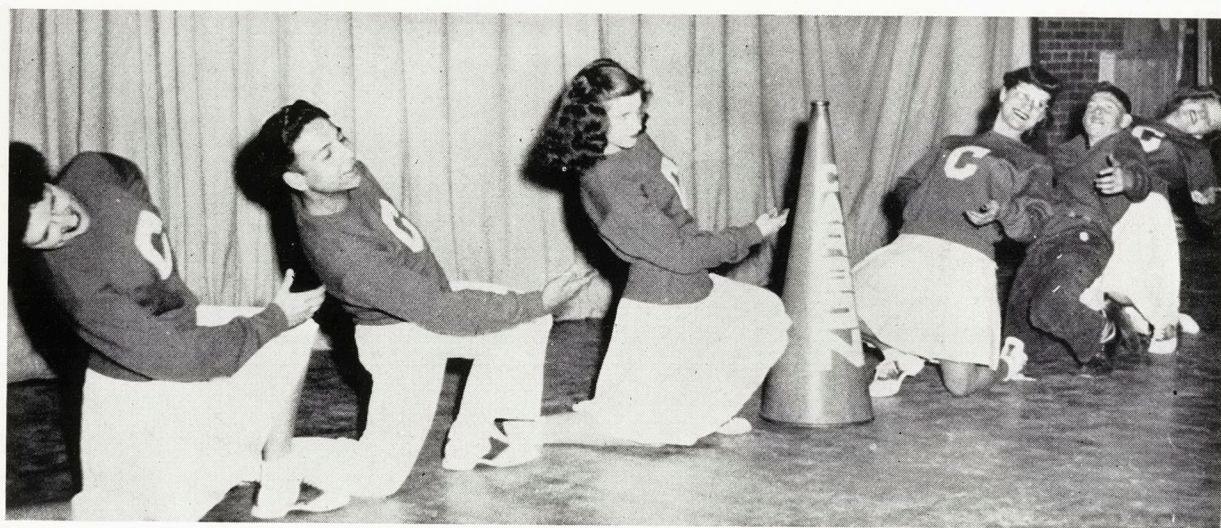
The said seven hold the record of having more "bull confabs," tearing down the reputations of more people and of having more school personalities in this yearbook than any other group.

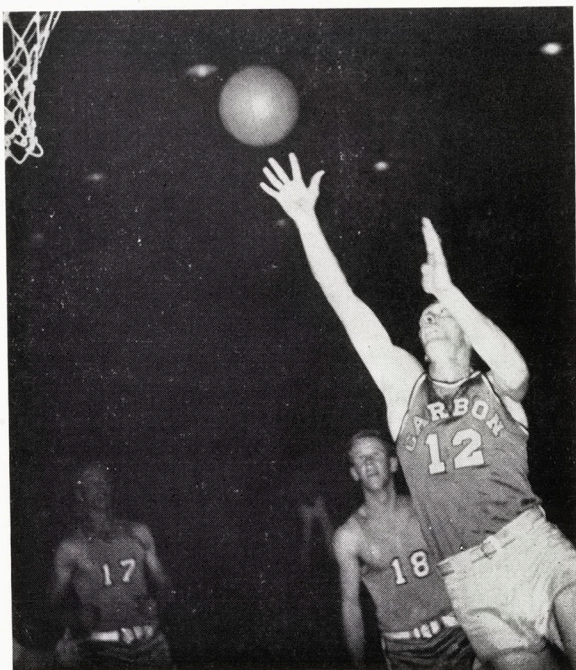


College Basketball

Living up to expectations the Carbon Eagles ended up in third place in the Intermountain Junior College League. They featured a fast-breaking double post offense and a shifting zone defense.

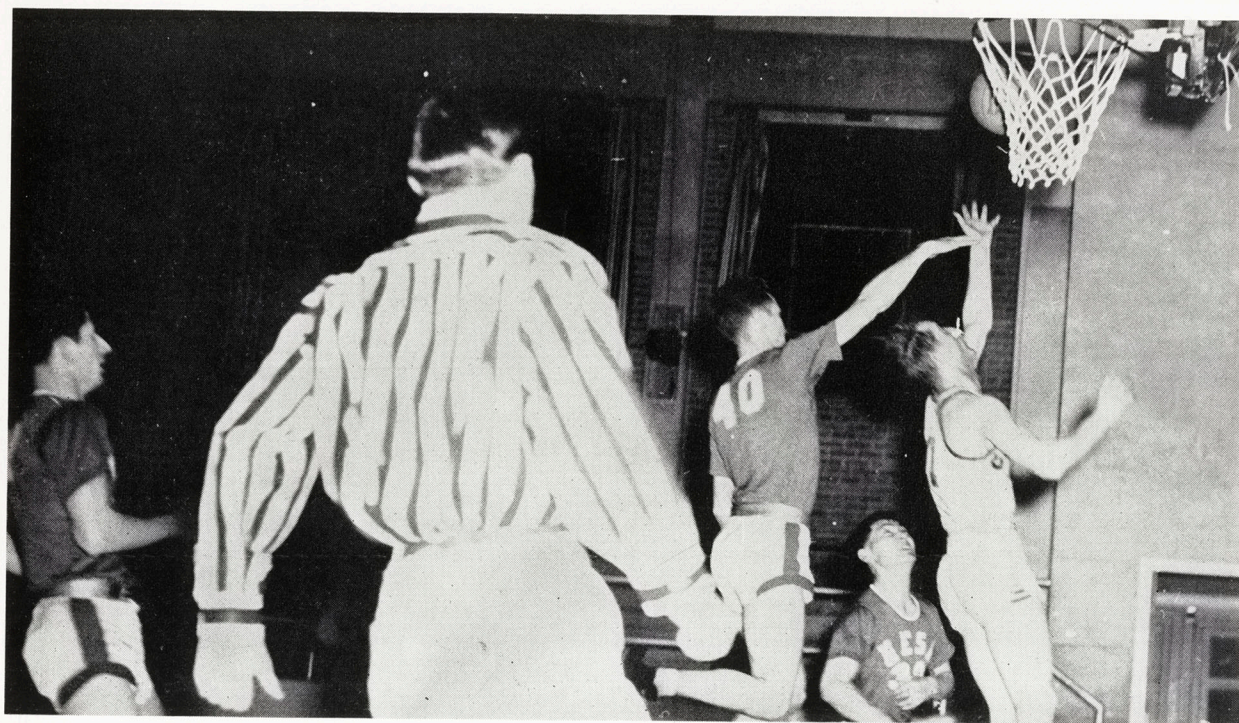

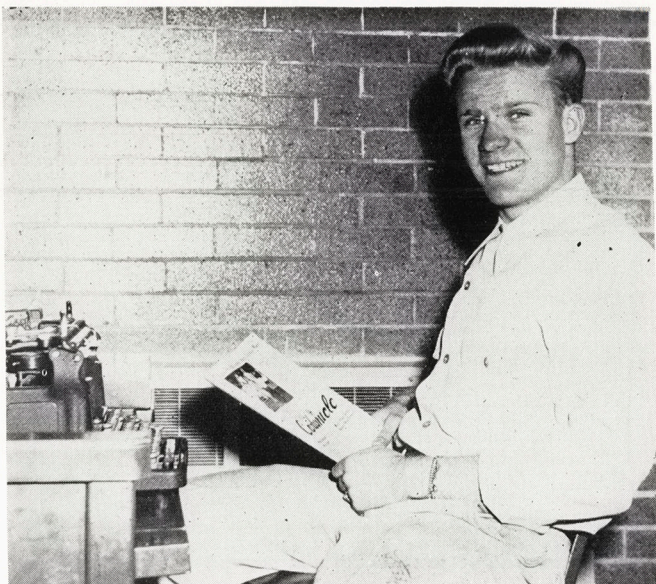
High School Debate

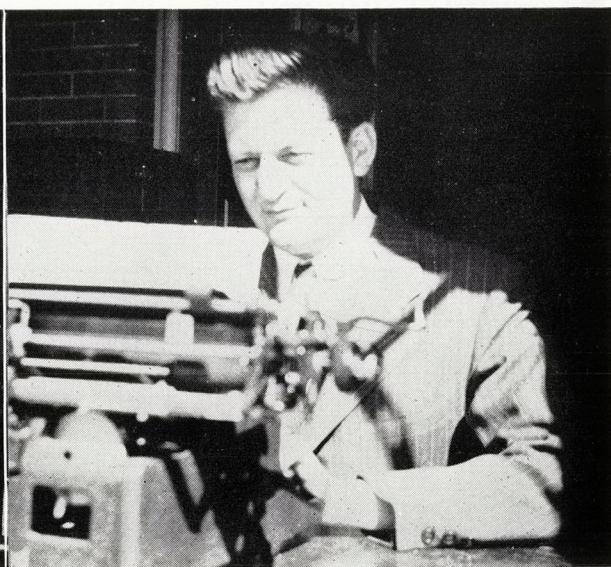

It was necessary for the first time to charge the students for the Carbonicle. Five cents brought you the up-to-date news about the campus.

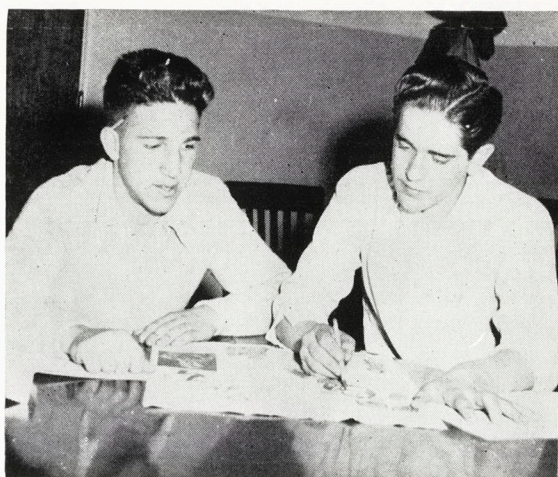
