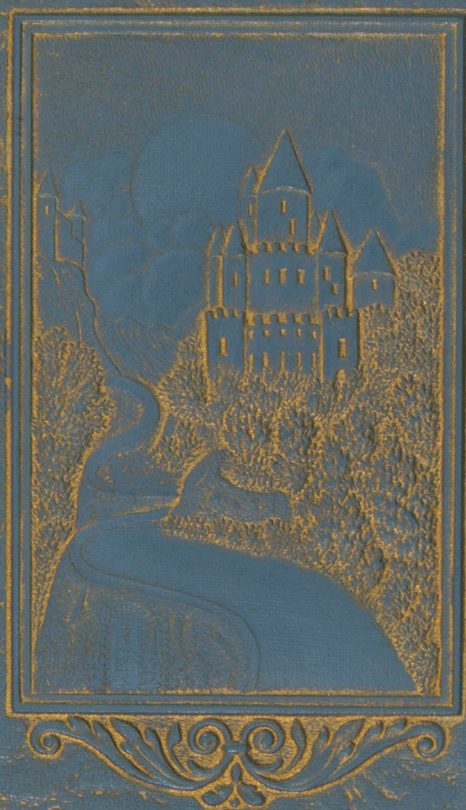

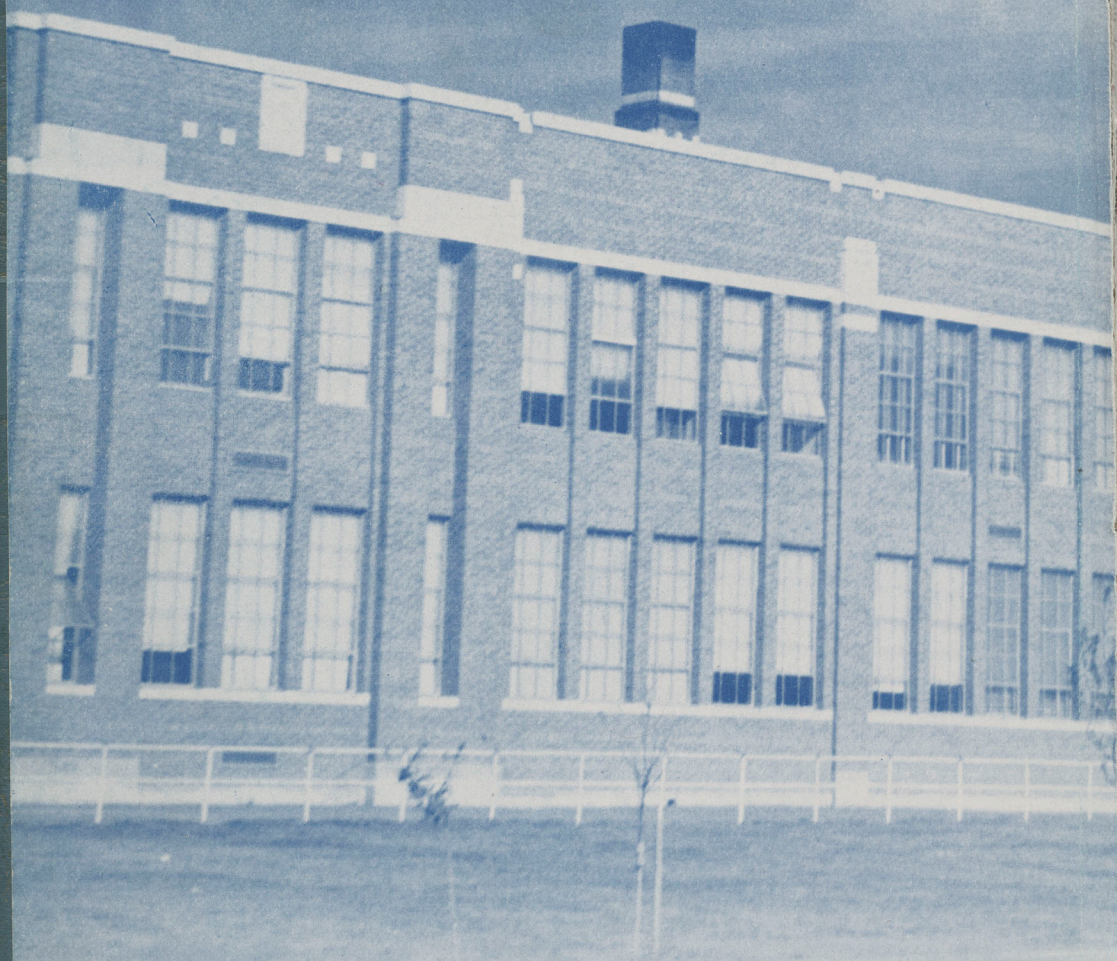

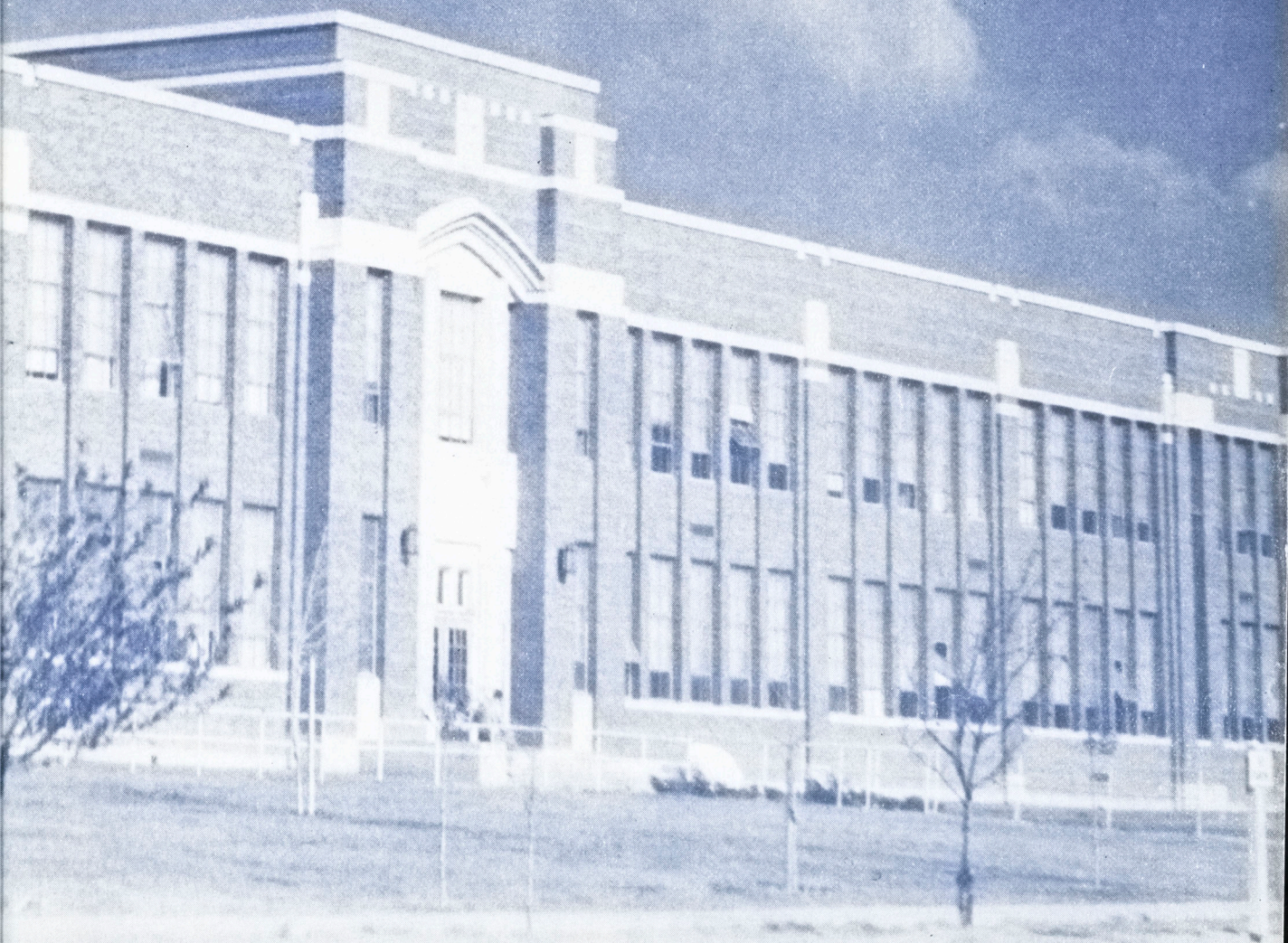
"WRITE SOMETHING IN MY BOOK"

And murmur, "Have you written in my book?"*

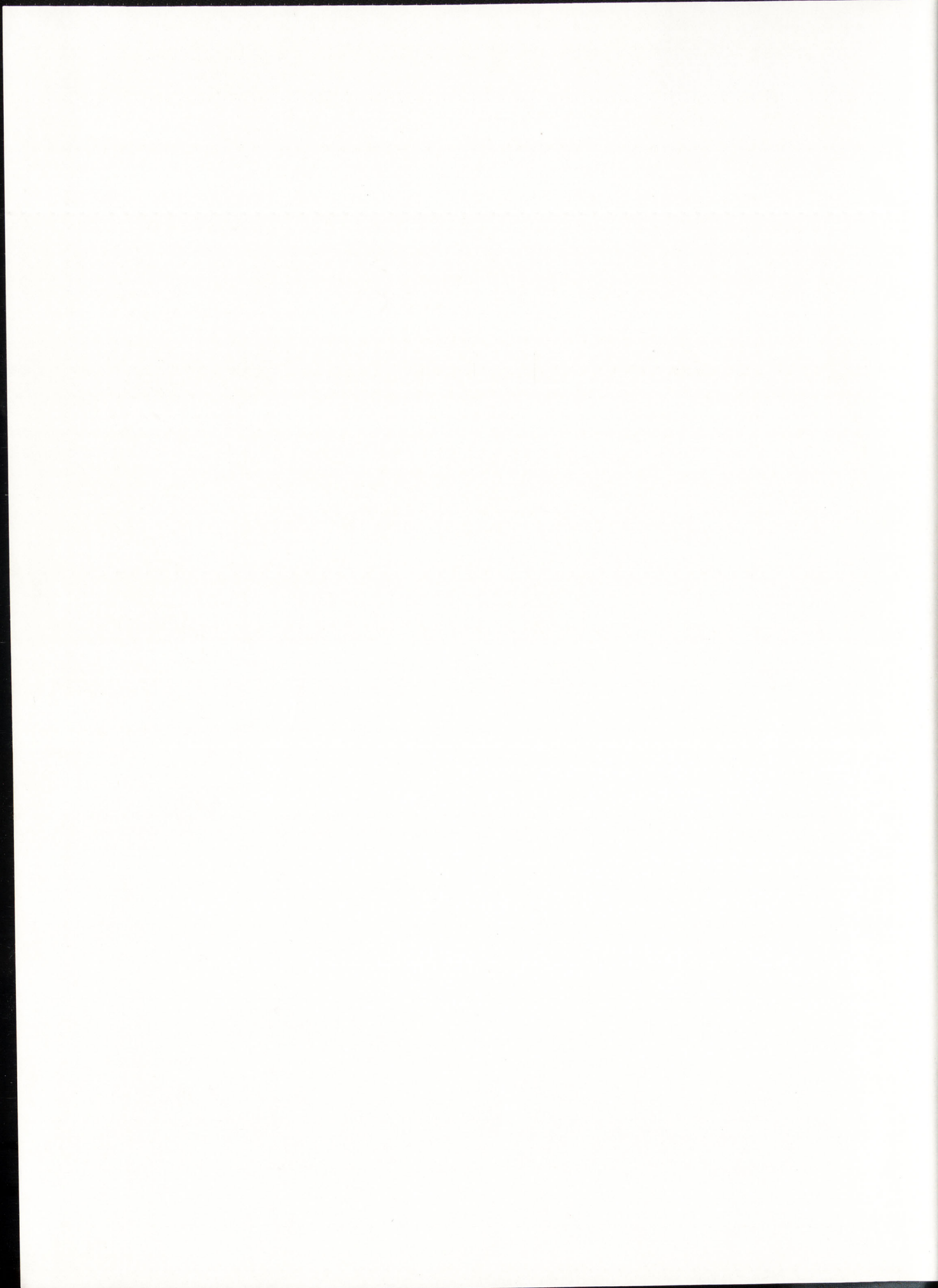
*They huddle on the stairways, in a trance,

And keep it exciting as a two-old-maids' row.

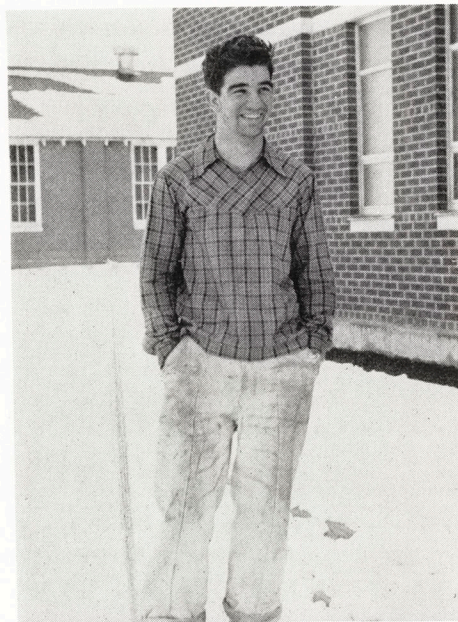
