Master's eye.







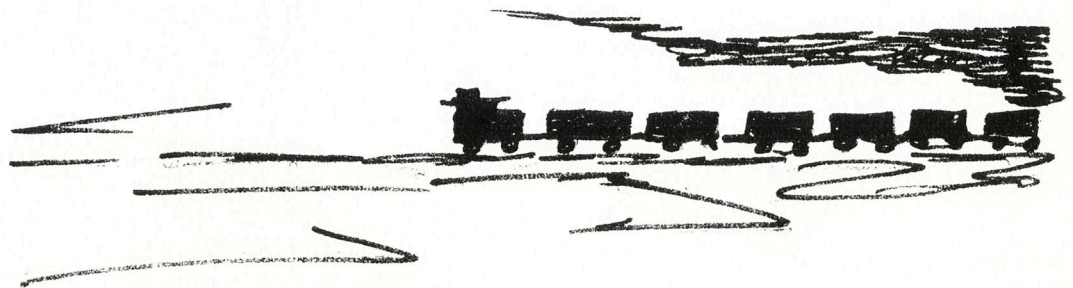

 but . . .

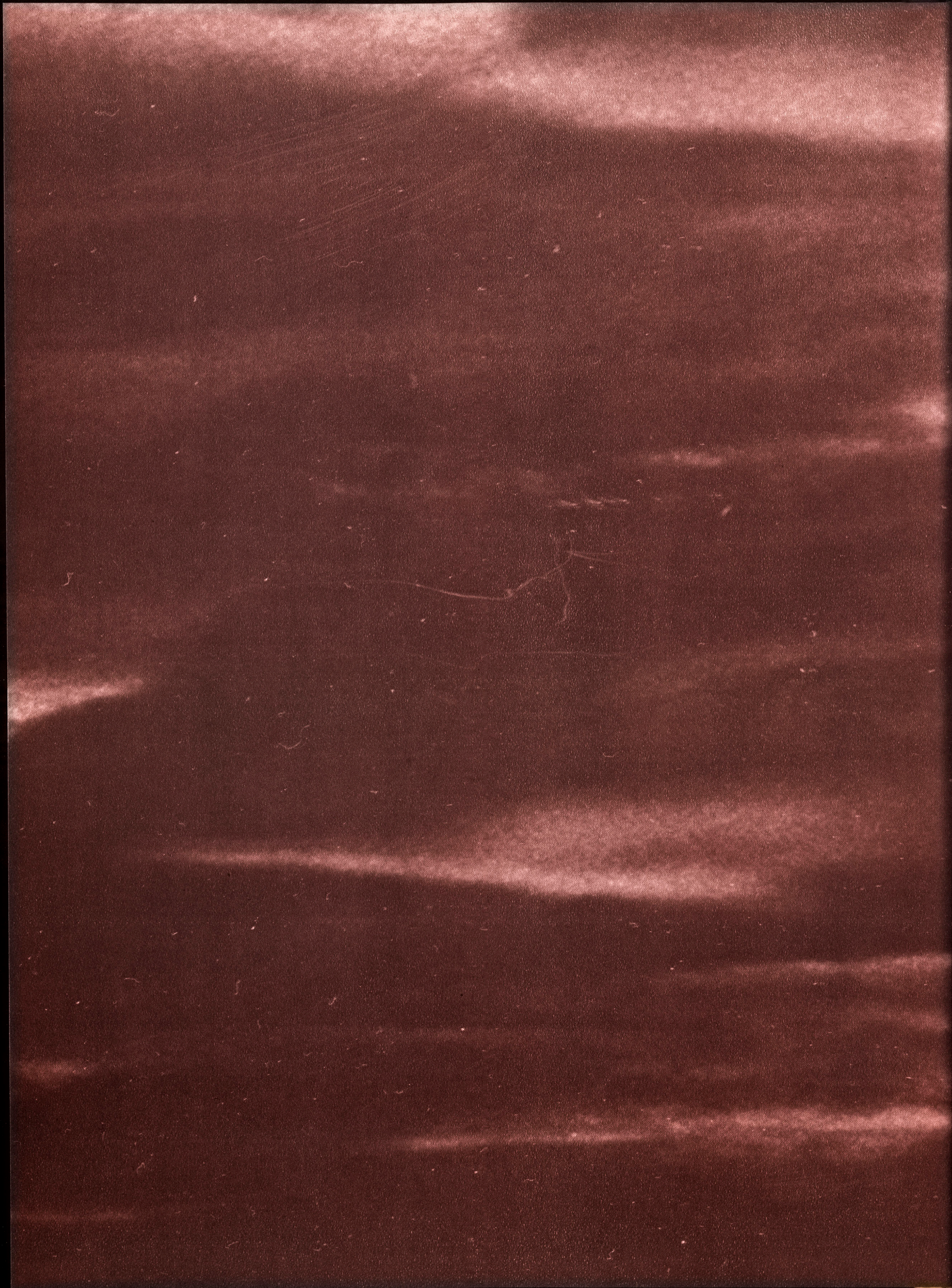
We will be on the afternoon train

 Waiting for the honey bee


