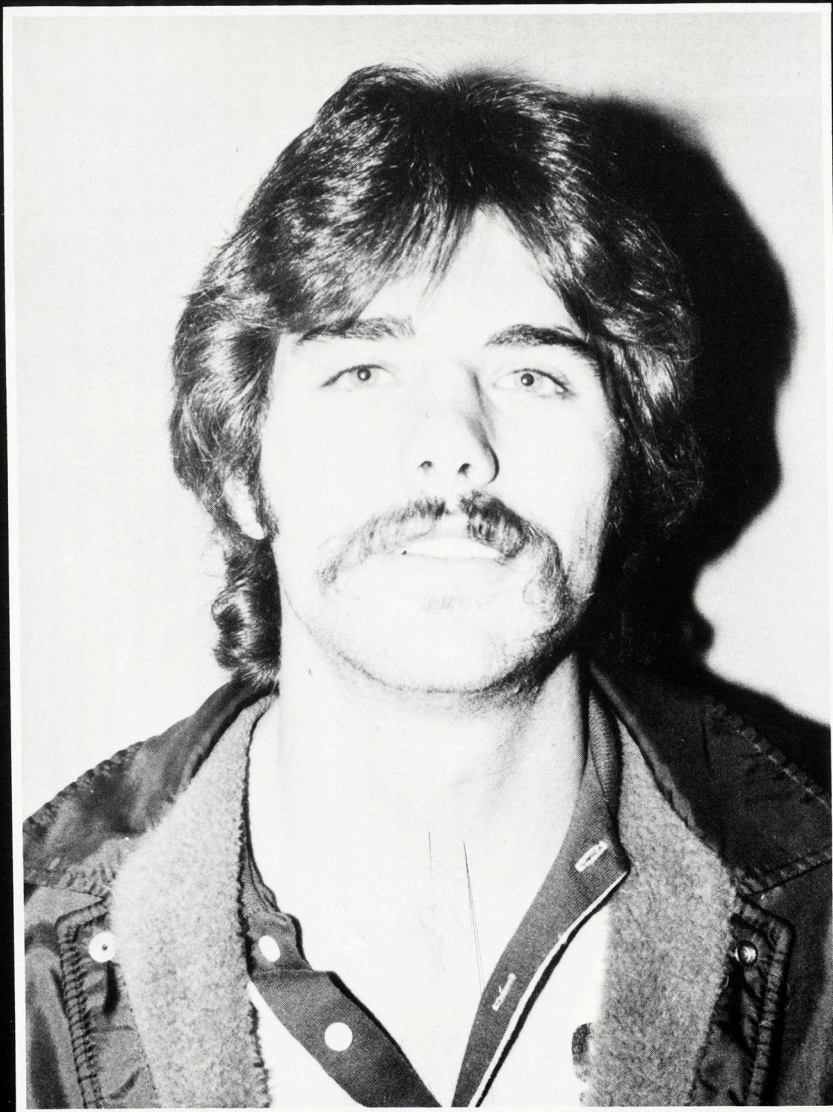
AMS

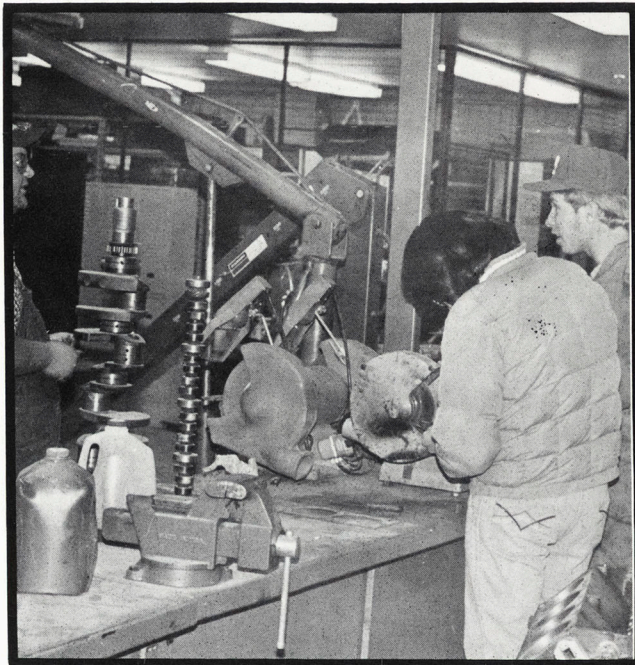

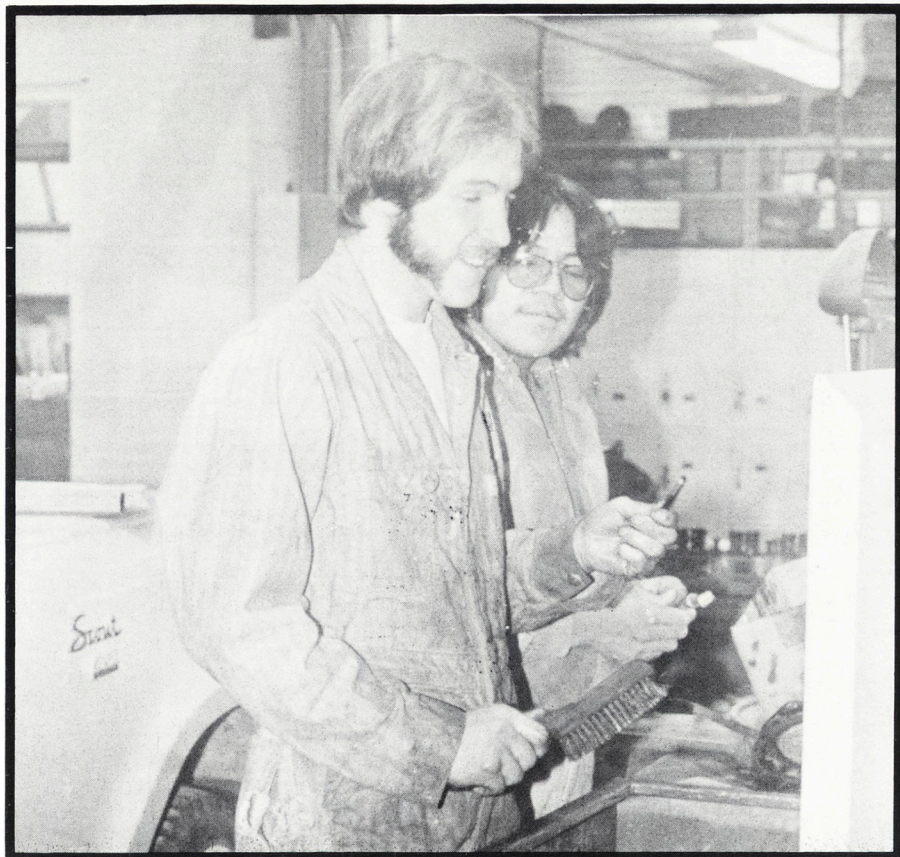

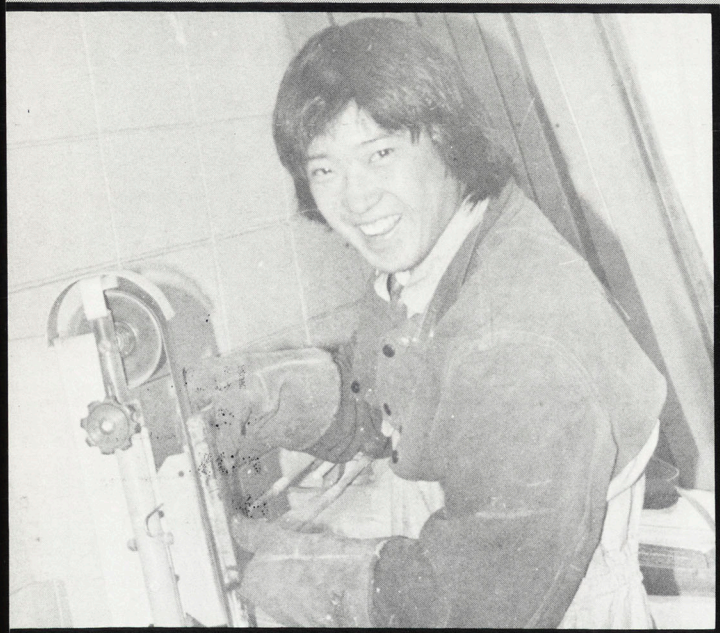
C.E.U.'s shop has an excellent selection of the latest in diagnostic equipment, in fact some of these machines can't be found anywhere else in the area.

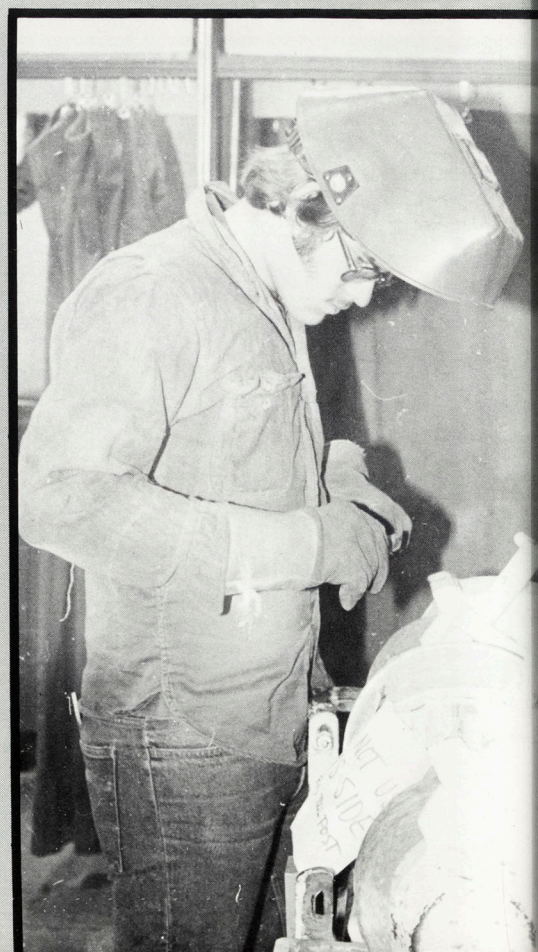

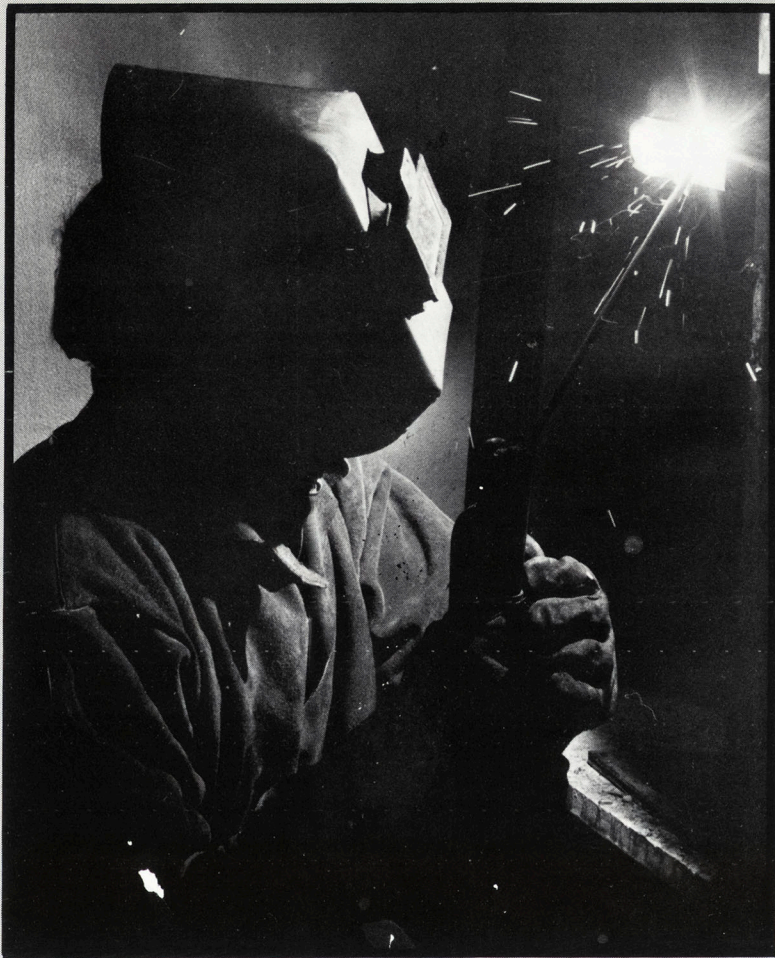

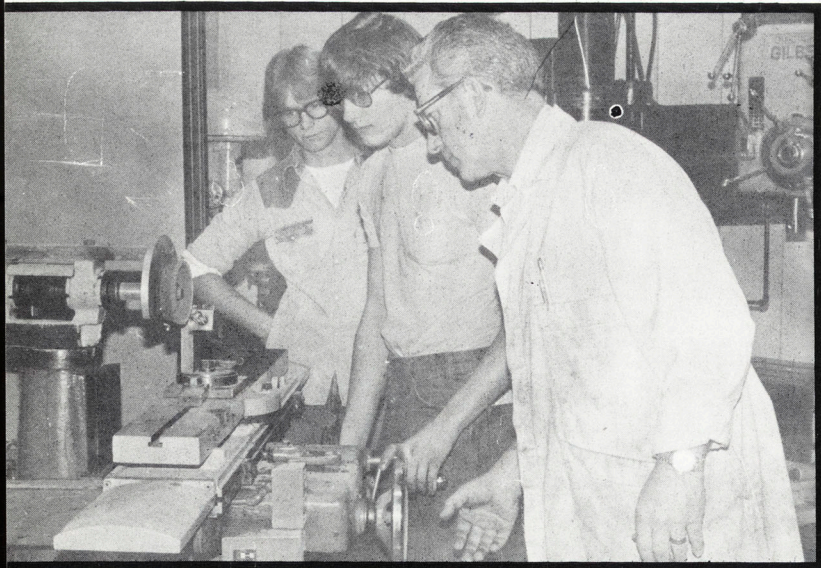
Precision Machining Technology

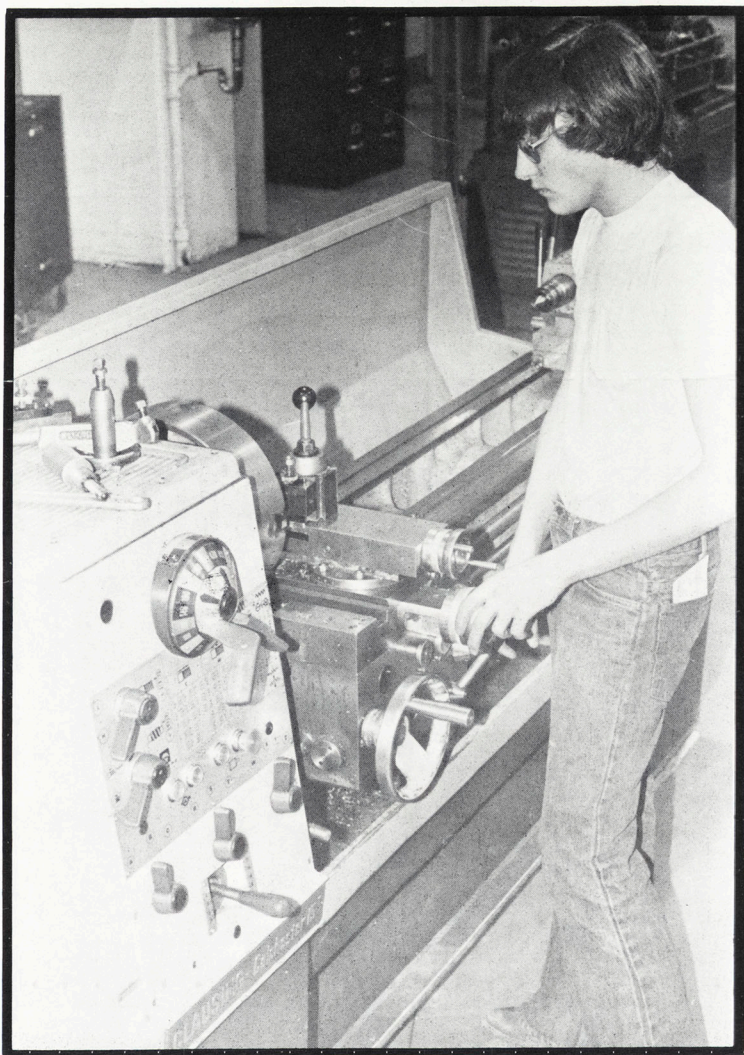

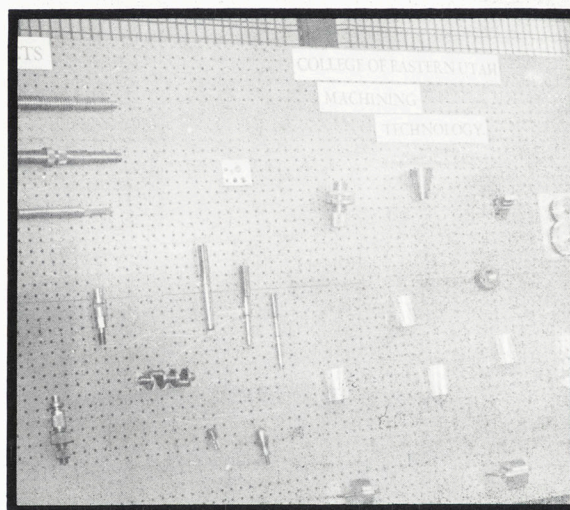


(Above) Learning how to operate the machines is a challenge in itself. (Right) Concentration is required for precision drilling.

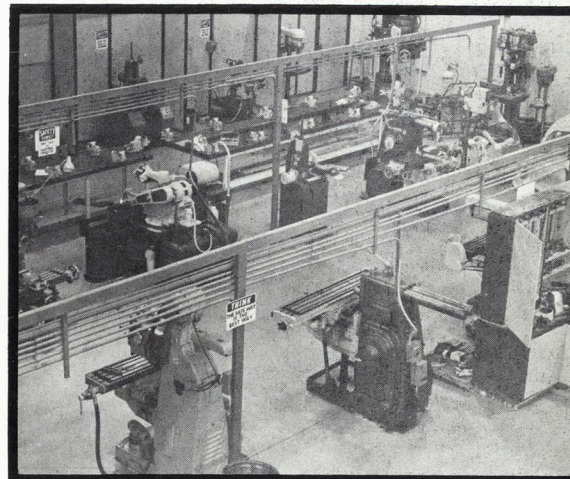
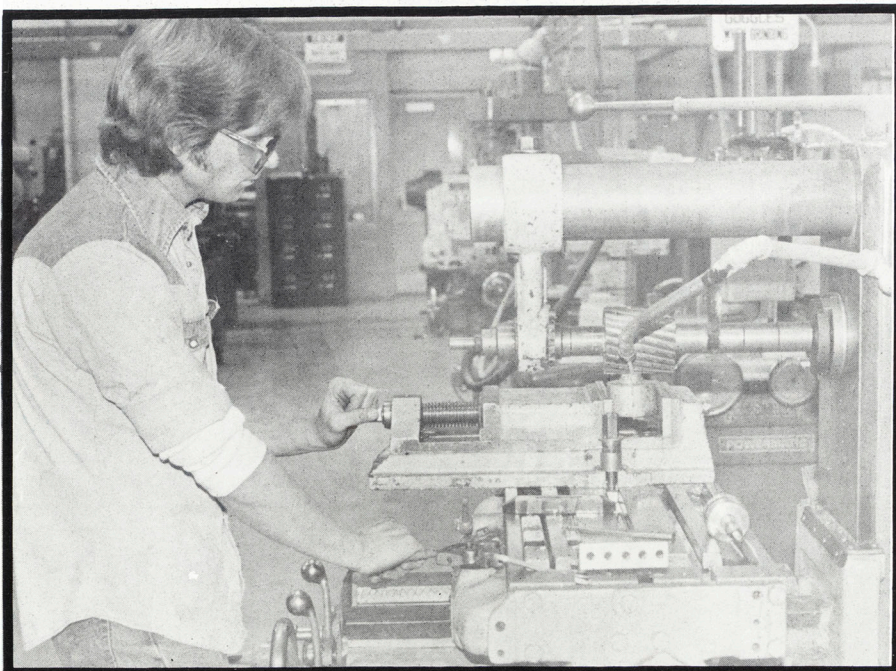

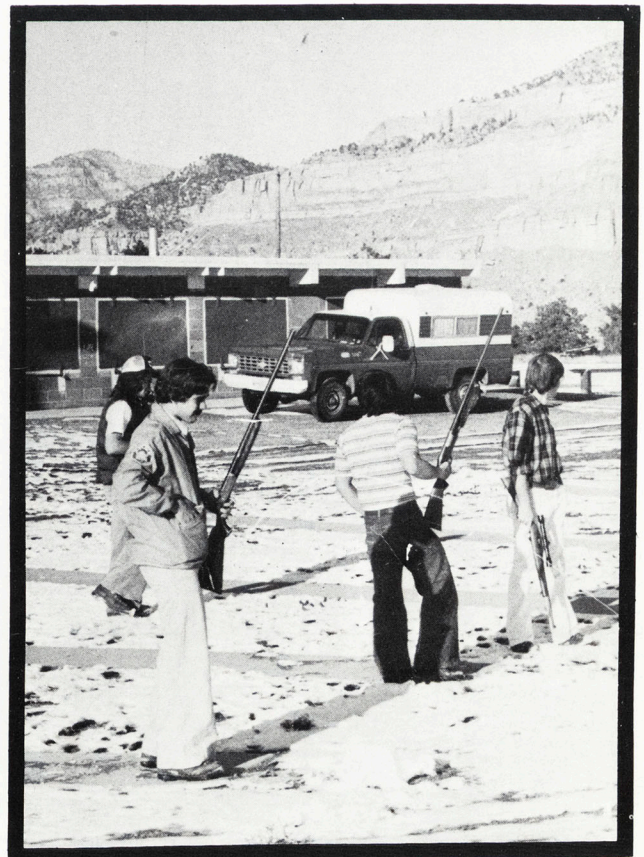

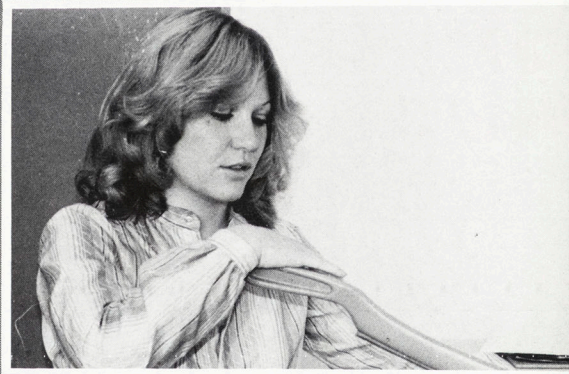

The Eagle is put together at the Sun Advocate. It takes three days of hard work at the Sun Advocate to print the paper, and it's well worth it!!

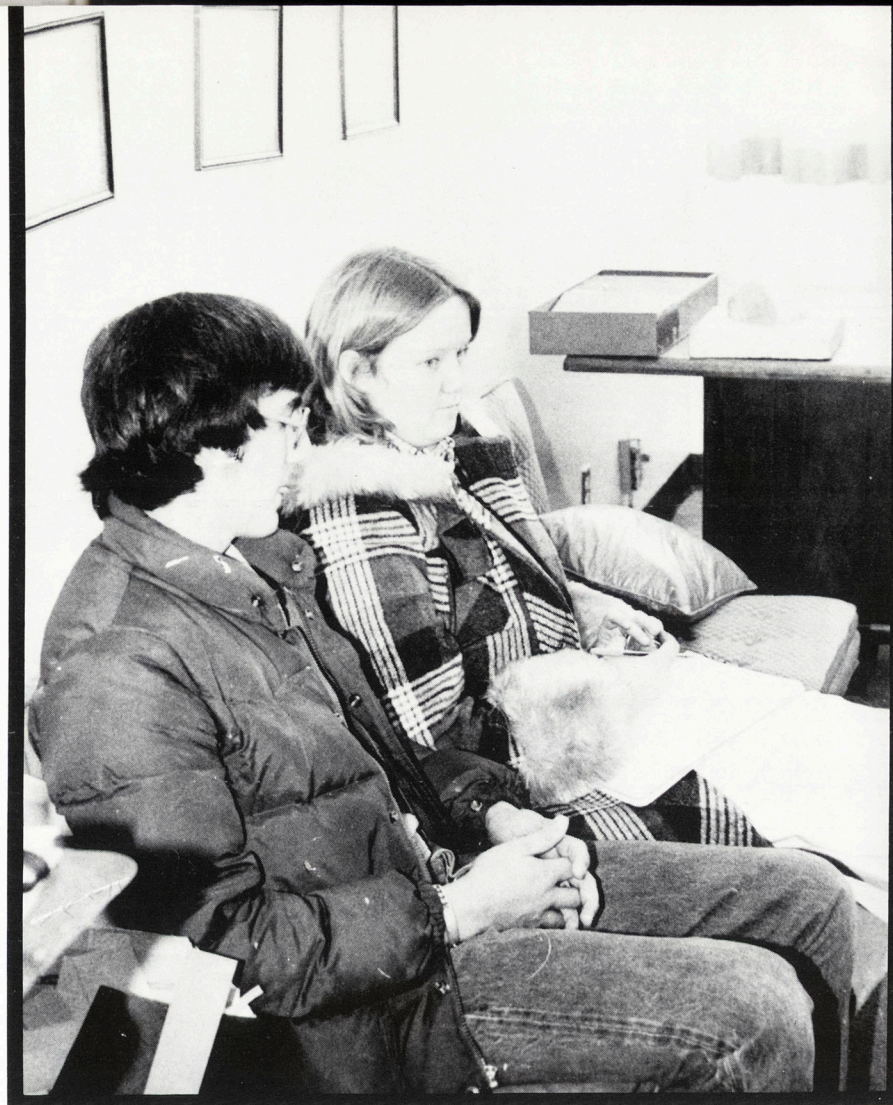


Nurses

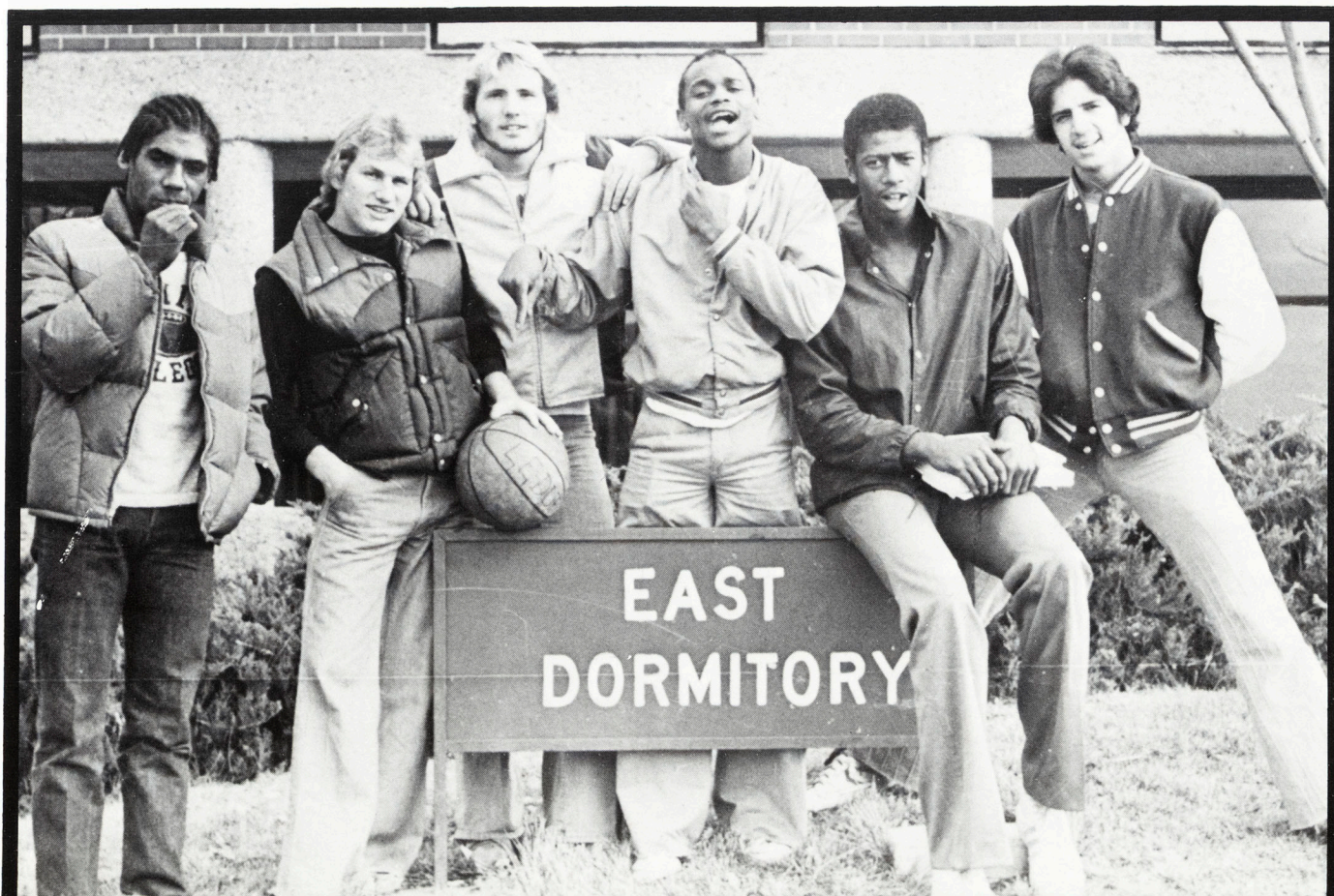




ASCEU

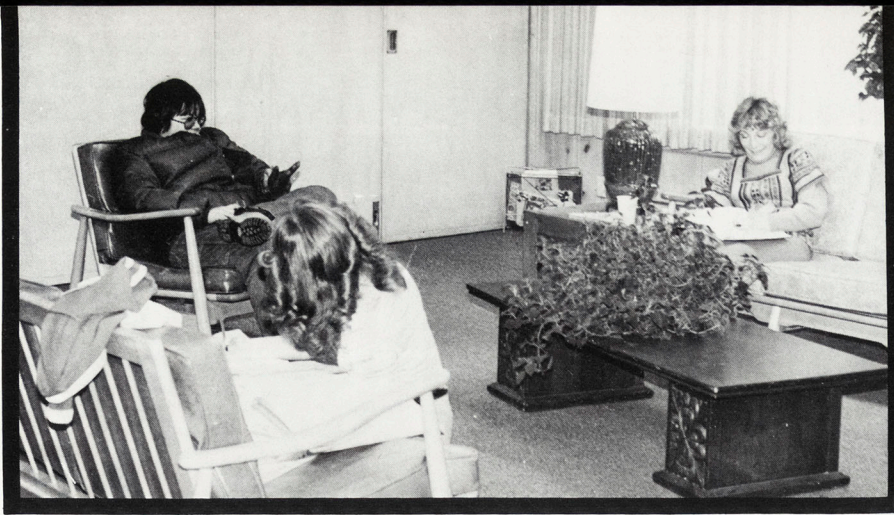
PFL ended the year with a cosmetic fair. Various number of distributors gave facial demonstrations on makeup and proper skin care.

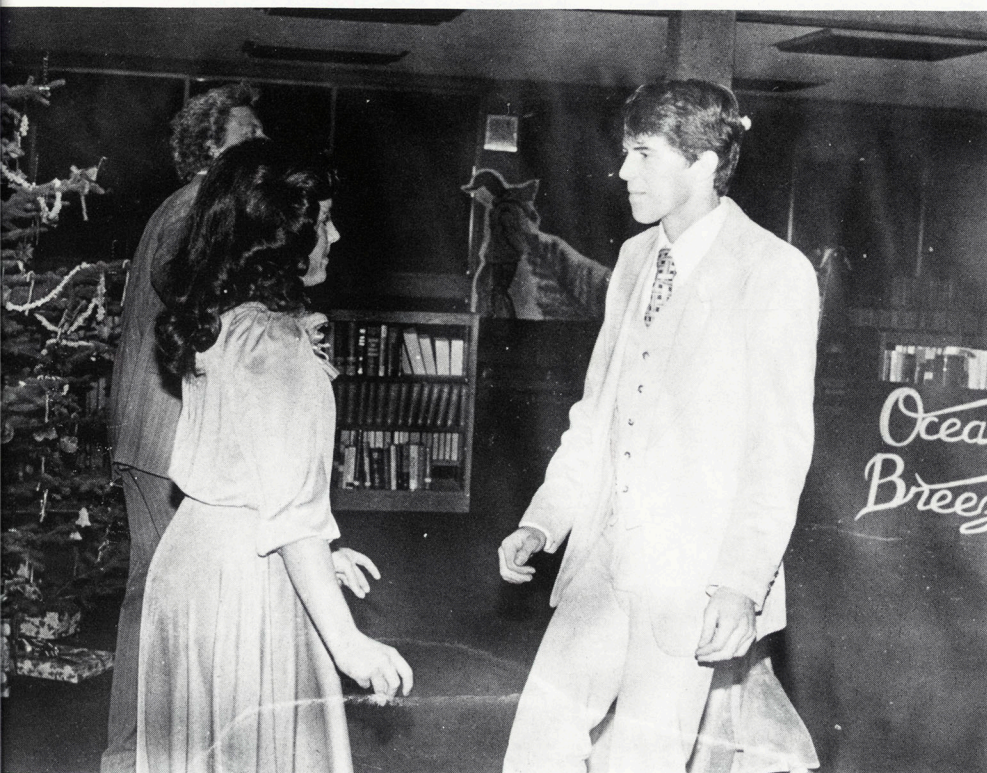

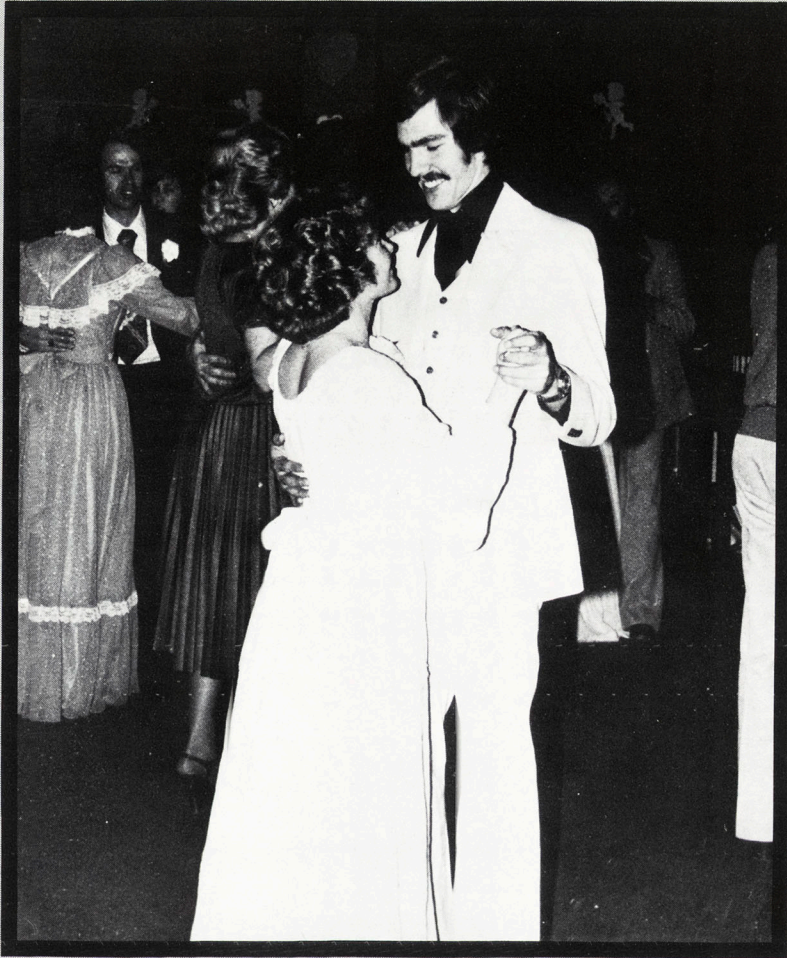
"Religion In Action Week"
