THE ECONOMIC IMPACT OF UINTAH COUNTY'S

ABSTRACT

Uintah County is home to a multiactivity conference complex located in Vernal, Utah. The complex is almost in constant use and includes locally sponsored activities, as well as regional and national activities. An estimate of local and nonlocal users were identified from Mr. Derk Hatch, manager of Western Park. I assumed that "nonlocal" use originated outside the county. Taking into account the "local" and "nonlocal" mix, it is estimated that the center annually generates over \$4.8 million dollars in economic activity, with approximately 60% a result of direct expenditures. The complex also results in additional employment opportunities for approximately 136 individuals, summarizing direct, indirect, and induced effects. The county's population change as a result of the center is just over 300 persons. These estimates assume that the county would be at or near full-employment in the absence of the Western Park complex.

THE ECONOMIC IMPACT OF UINTAH COUNTY'S

Development or business activity in a community may have an impact beyond that associated with initial purchases. These impacts are often characterized as "multiplier" effects and reflect activity that is generated in other sectors of an economy following some initial spending. This spending is often referred to as an *injection* becasue it is a new expenditures to the area in question.

A leakage is that portion of the original expenditure that does not stay in the community but has to be spent in the purchase of goods and services that will later be sold within the community. The only impact that should be attributed to the local community is that which actually stays within the community.

Generally, the smaller the community, the larger the leakages will be. Hence, the primary and second impacts would be expected to be relatively smaller. Such is the case with the Western Park. Because a relatively large portion of the goods and services associated with the existence and operation of the Western Park are brought in from outside (i.e., from the food service sector), a substantial portion of the original expenditure will not remain in the community.

There are several other features that are also critical in this analysis.

First, because much of the actual operating budget is provided from county-level taxes, they cannot be considered as a net addition to the community. That is, because tax revenue would either not be collected or spent on some other function or activity, annual operating costs associated with the Park are not considered "new" or "additional" expenditures. Therefore, no specific impact is associated with that activity. We recognize that because some of the activities are not financed strictly through tax revenues (i.e., receipts from concerts, etc.), this impact analysis will understate the activity associated with the "new" activity in question.

Second, it is always difficult to estimate what expenditures would occur in the absence of the activity in question. For instance, if the Western Park did not exist, how much of the "nonlocal" activity would still occur, i.e., tourists purchasing gasoline, meals, and lodging? It is only when an activity is a "destination" activity can expenditures rightfully be attributed to the activity in question. This is particularly troublesome with respect to the Western Museum since many of the nonlocal museum patrons are no doubt in Vernal for other reasons. Therefore, we have only attributed "nonlocal" expenditures that seem consistent with such concerns. For instance, we do not assume that any lodging expenditures were associated with the Western Park unless the meetings or activities occurred over a period of two more or more days. Once again, this means that this estimate likely understates the true impact of the Western Park since it is highly likely that some overnight lodging occurs even with events that only last one day.

Third, the actual level of expenditures associated with any activity can only be correctly assessed if a detailed survey is done of participants. Obviously, that is not possible under the current study time

frame and design. Therefore, it has been necessary to "estimate" what expenditures have been made. Per capita food expenditures were based on either: (a) standard per diem rates, or (b) the level of food expenditures gleaned from other studies. Furthermore, expenditures were calculated only for "nonlocal" users as it is assumed that local people would have to purchase food or meals locally anyway. Gasoline purchases (with associated automobile service activities) were estimate at \$12/day. Finally, lodging expenses were estimated at only \$15/day/person. While this likely overstates the impact of many of the activities since the participants often stay (camp) within the Western Park, it is believed that by not allocating lodging to any day-length events, we have reasonably estimated what the average impact would be. If anything, the approach used in valuing these three expenditure areas understates the impact.

Finally, we recognize that activities associated with the Western Park change from year to year. There is no way to obtain a year-by-year estimate of impacts. We feel that the estimated impacts are representative of the general nature and purpose of the Western Park and, consequently, the values probably reflect an average impact.

Types of Impacts

There are three types of impacts associated with any business activity: direct, indirect, and induced.

Direct impacts are those initial (new) expenditures that are made within a community for the purchase of a good or service. In the case of the Western Park, expenditures generally are assumed to occur within three major sectors: gasoline-related activity, food and restaurant activity, and lodging.

Indirect impacts are the added expenditures made by the various industries that support the sector in which new expenditures are being made. In the case of the Western Park, indirect impacts might be expected in the manufacturing sector, as well as feed and food production.

Induced impacts are those impacts resulting from the additional income payments made to local residents as a result of the new activity. As business is conducted, additional income flows to local residents which, in turn, stimulates additional activity.

IMPLAN Input/Output Model

The microcomputer-based IMPLAN Input/Output (I/O) model was used in this analysis. Many of the criticisms of I/O models are valid including: (1) concerns about the data-intensive nature of such models, (2) fixed input/ouput coefficients, and (3) changing technologies. However, the changes analyzed in this study are small enough relative to the county's total economic activity that it is unlikely that the I/O results are far from the actual values.

Local Expenditures

A detailed listing of activities for all of 1995 and most of 1996 was obtained from Mr. Derk Hatch, manager of the Western Park. He also provided an estimate of the number of "local" and "nonlocal" participants. We assumed that "nonlocal" participants generally originated outside of Uintah County. Taking into account the "local" and "nonlocal" mix, it is estimated that the following level of local expenditures could be attributed to its existence and operation (Table 1). An actual activity and participant listing for 1995 is attached as Appendix A.

As noted in Table 1, it would be incorrect to assume that the entire \$4.8 million is a direct expenditure due to the fact that many goods are services are purchased from outside of the community and brought into the community. Table 2 provides a summary of the various impacts associated with the expenditures as noted in Table 1.

Summary

It can be seen that over \$2.7 million in direct impact and \$1.2 million in induced impact are realized annually as a result of activities associated with the Western Park. The total impact on final demand is slightly over \$4 million. Total industrial output, which includes direct, indirect, and induced impacts, is even larger at over \$4.6 million. Employee income, including direct, indirect, and induced, exceeds \$1.3 million annually, and property income exceeds \$600 thousand. Total income earned annually as a result of Western Park's existence and operation is over \$1.9 million, and over \$2.3 million is added in value as a result of the activities associated with the Western Park. As expected, the direct employment effects are the largest, over 96 persons per year, but significant employment is generated from both indirect and induced activities (slightly over 40 employees). Total population change in the community is slightly over 300 persons.

More detail, with respect to which sectors are impacted the greatest by the existence and operation of the Western Park, is provided in Appendices B through E.

Key to Appendices B Through E

Four sets of tables are provided for the Western Park, each one describing a different level of impact analysis. For instance, Appendix B reflects the *direct* impacts, Appendix C reflects the *indirect* impacts, Appendix D summarizes the *induced* impacts, while Appendix E describes the *total* impacts.

Each table contains a listing of industry sectors along the left-hand side of the page. The first numerical column contains estimates of the changes in final demand attributable to the Western Park. By dropping the decimal and adding two zeroes to the right side of the value, one can convert the table values into actual dollars values. The values shown for the number of employees do not require such a transformation. The values are added up for each column, with the totals reflected at the bottom of the page.
