I have your letter of the 29th. Domestic science and art are not uniformly taught in the public schools of Indiana. Only a few rural schools teach manual training. The subject of drawing is taught in nearly all of the cities having a population of 5,000 or more. Domestic science is not taught in our normal school. We have a manual training school in Indianapolis and some of the grade schools look after this matter for this city.
