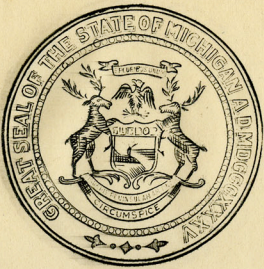

My Dear Sir:-

In reply to your letter of the 29th inst. will say that  
in  
Domestic Science is being introduced in some of the public schools.  
Is at present used at Calumet, Grand Rapids, Kalamazoo, Muskegon,  
and Detroit. It has not been introduced to any extent in any  
other school of the state, and not to any extent in those mentioned.

Manual training has been introduced in more of the schools.  
The work is done by special teachers. The Agricultural  
College at Lansing is the only institution in the state, which  
gives a course or courses in Domestic Science. The subject has  
not as yet been introduced in our normal school, but will be in  
time. In the public school the expense is borne by the  
school district and not by the state.
