Dear Sir:

I wrote you sometime ago from Stanford Univ. asking that my name be considered as an applicant for a position as instructor in the Chemistry or Geology department of the Agricultural College, should there be a vacancy there this coming year. Since writing you, I have completed my last semester's work, thus filling all the requirements for graduation except those for entrance. In my previous letter I think I stated that no entrance credit was given me for my work in the Southern Branch of the Utah State Normal School. This action was based entirely on a technicality - at least that was the statement the Registrar made when I discussed the matter with him - I had not graduated from an accredited school giving a four years course. Since arriving here, however, I have received

word from the Registrar that $8\frac{1}{2}$ units have been granted me toward regular undergraduate standing. This coming year, I wish to work off those credits which I lack and also teach. Should you be able to give me a position, I should be very much obliged if you would notify me at your earliest convenience. So far as remuneration is concerned, I have a brother who wants to attend the A. B. next year, and I would like to earn enough to cover his and my own expenses while there.

I will inclose a letter from Mr. Clark who was Principal at the Normal School the last year I was there; under separate cover I will also send a Stanford register in which I have checked off the courses in Geology & Mining and Chemistry which I have taken. I think the other work I have taken would be of little interest to you as it is scattered thruout the various departments. If you should desire it, however, I would be pleased to forward to you a complete statement of my work and also the credit slips which I received thruout my course.

I do not wish to flood you with letters but I thought that the change in my plans was of sufficient importance to justify my writing you again.

Trusting that I may hear from you as soon as conditions will permit, I remain
