Dear Sir: _

Your letter of the 4th. inst. duly received. In reply
I would state as follows:

1st. Age 32, married, one child.

2nd. Graduate Newburgh, N.Y. Academy. Graduate West Point Military
Academy.

3rd. None except as instructor in officers schools and schools
for enlisted men.

4th. Depends upon the desires of the War Department.

5th. Do not know the nature of the work required - would rather
have the authorities of the college propose compensation.

I would be pleased if you would give me information as follows:

Extent of authority of officer in military department.

Nature of work desired other than military.

Nature of quarters furnished, as residence.

Importance attached to military matters.

As to references desired I would state that my regiment and
immediate commanding officers have gone to the Philippines but
as the War Department which has my record for fourteen years on

file has seen fit to recommend me to you I refer you to them
for particulars. The recommendation has been made without sollicit-
itation from me.
