

I will say in reply to your favor of Dec. 6th that it will give me pleasure to communicate with representative Fishburn in regard to the position proposed for him on the committee on education, and also to do what I can in the way of securing for members of the committee on education men who comprehend the needs of our schools and who are able and willing to secure legislation favorable to the educational interests of the state.
