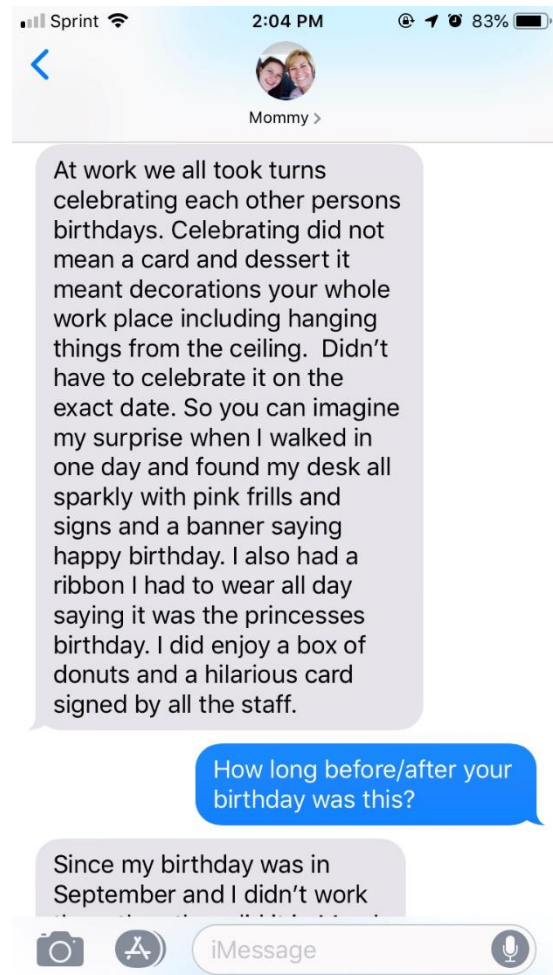
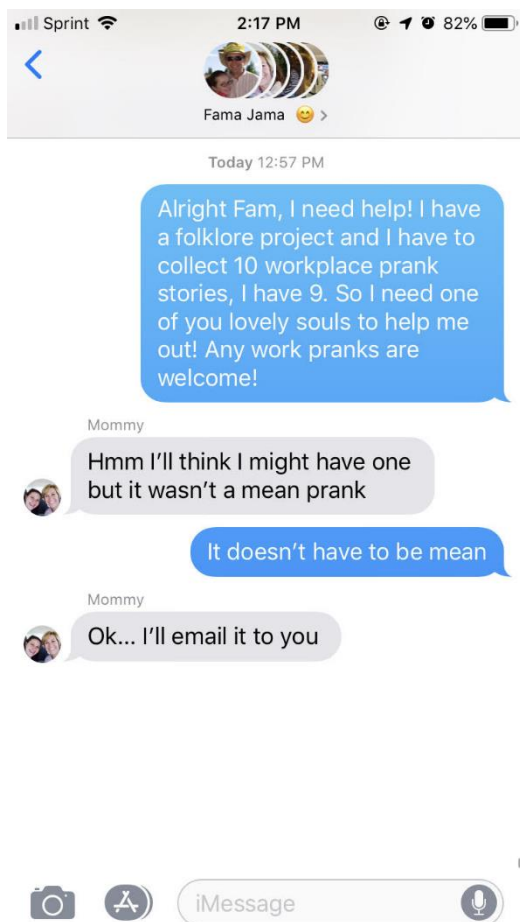
Informant:
