CARL LACKEY is a game biologist with the Nevada Department of Wildlife (NDOW). He graduated from the University of Nevada, Reno in 1990 and has worked for NDOW as a human–bear conflict specialist since 1996. He and his research partner, Jon Beckmann of the Wildlife Conservation Society, have been studying urban black bear ecology for >20 years. He also serves as a member of the International Bear Association’s Management Committee. In addition to black bears, his position includes management responsibilities of cougars, furbearers, and ungulates along the Carson Front of the Sierra Nevada.



JOHN M. TOMEČEK will serve *Human–Wildlife Interactions* as an associate editor. He is an assistant professor and extension wildlife specialist at Texas A&M University. As PI of the Texas Carnivore Ecology Laboratory, he leads efforts to expand knowledge of the ecology, behavior, and interactions of humans with carnivores. Much of his work centers on carnivore ecology, wildlife damage management, and zoonotic disease ecology and management. He leads the National Chronic Wasting Disease Extension Working Group and is a member of the Wild Pig and Cattle Fever Tick Interagency Task Forces in Texas. He currently serves on boards and working groups with various professional societies that address these issues, while also serving as Vice President of the Texas Chapter of the Wildlife Society.
