DEBATING

The announcement of the question for debate in the Utah State Triangle, should stimulate those students who have any aspirations along this line, to put in some hard work in preparation for the coming try-outs.

Probably in no other activity at the College does the student gain so much actual development as in forensics. The power to think while on one's feet, the ability to analyze a question with which the nation today is struggling, the practise gained in "putting over" the conclusions arrived at after having made a very thorough study of a subject, the development of fluency of speech and the stimulus to thought which participation in debating offers—all are practical advantages to be gained by the conscientious effort which the debater must expend. Added to these, of course, is the honor which a debater gains and the privilege of representing his alma mater, which, however, are secondary to the development which the debater receives.

Last year the U. A. C. debaters, under the admirable coaching of the Debating Council, won the state championship and two out of three of the other debates. This year we have that championship to defend, and the prospective debater at the College must be prepared to sacrifice a great many personal pleasures in order to put in the study which will make him thoroughly prepared for the contests. The standard of debating maintained at the U. A. C. is high, indeed, and it must be kept upon that plane which has brought the College recognition in the past.

PRESIDENT COMMENTS ATTITUDE

To the Editor of Student Life:

I would like sufficient space in Student Life to express to the students my appreciation of the high standard not only of scholarship, but of student conduct which has characterized the year thus far.

Of recent years the Utah Agricultural College has become an institution of notable standards. Years ago all inter-mountain colleges were substantially of high school class. We have assumed high collegiate rating only during the past comparatively few years. Such has been true of practically all colleges and universities in the West. Some of these institutions as they have grown in a scholastic way have still kept their high school habits. It is not uncommon to hear of duckings and hair cuttings applied to Freshmen, or of college or university students painting up a town. It has been a great source of pride to me to note that this College has not indulged in these and other similar high school stunts. The better colleges and universities do no longer do such things. They leave to the high schools such antics where they may be excused or even enjoyed. But for a college or university to tolerate such things immediately puts the institution, no matter how large it may think itself to be, in the class of very backward institutions lacking in educational refinement. Students at certain institutions in our own Conference still permit such action among the students, thus belittling the universities or colleges they represent. Such action by students of any institution is an expression of smallness of spirit.

We have at the College here this year a very high class student body, the best by far we have ever had. We want these men and women to pattern after the great institutions of America not imitate the very coarse so-called university or college spirit which in habits some of our campuses. Let us set for ourselves great collegiate tasks worthy of the exceptional history of this institution. The College paper, the various professional and social organizations, the appearance of our students in public, the orderliness of student conduct, the sportsmanship of the teams which represent us, the hard work which seems to be the lot of everybody here—all these manifestations bespeak a certain distinction which is a great honor to the institution.

Let us each year go up to a little higher level and never tolerate a step down in standard of conduct.

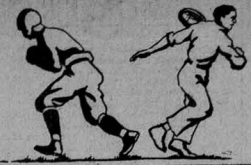

Aggie injuries in the Mines battle were not of a serious nature, Jack Croft, husky captain, was the only man put on the casualty list. This is not serious. The huge tackle will be in the best of condition for the B. Y. U. conflict.
