Winter Quarter Opens January 3--Courses In Every Department Begin

Three Hundred Courses of Every Rank To Start When the Winter Quarter Opens

A Heavy Registration Is Expected By Registrar Student Activities Are Many

Courses in every department of the institution will begin with the opening of the winter quarter at the Utah Agricultural College on Thursday, January 3, according to an announcement just made by Registrar P. E. Peterson, who says that before the start of the institution has been so many registration opportunities for entering students.

Over three hundred courses of co-educational, collegiate and graduate rank will begin when the winter work opens, taking the place of or supplementing the regular work of the quarter. The largest number of courses given by any single department is in the School of Mechanic Arts, where full opportunity will be given to high school graduates and students without high school training to get extensive training in all phases of mechanical arts and crafts. The School of Mechanic Arts of the U. A. C. is the largest department of its kind to be found in the entire west for this work.

Many courses will also be given in agriculture, including classes in poultry husbandry, animal husbandry, dairying, farm management and veterinary science. Departments in engineering, civil engineering, mechanical engineering, electrical engineering, and architecture are also being offered.

COLEGES C. 20 Extension Workers of State Convene Here Tomorrow and Friday

A conference for the purpose of discussing ways of carrying out the program of the recent extension workers conference at Fort Collins, Colorado, will be held at the Utah Agricultural College on Thursday and Friday of this week. Invitations have been sent out under the direction of Dr. C. E. Ryan, director of the extension division of the college, to business men, livestock raisers, farmers and other interested persons throughout the state. It is anticipated that a good representation will be present and that an extensive program of work will be planned.

The conference will take up the three projects that were considered at the Fort Collins meetings: range management, livestock production, dairying, and human nutrition. The reports of the conference committee will be presented and an extensive program of work will be planned.

Problems of a very important character to the farmers and stockmen are being discussed in the reports and it appears that a great deal of work must be done if the extension program is to be successful. Among other matters the following problems will be considered: (1) How to improve the output of production of beef and mutton, and (2) How to improve range and breeding conditions. It is hoped that the meeting will help to meet the needs of the constantly increasing western people and (3) How to improve the range by the promotion of rural health and new best to study health and eliminate problems through the extension program.

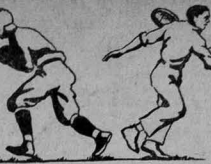
