B. Y. U. Conquers Lone Two Straight to Montana Five

Aggies Down Crimson Five In Two Game Series

Tightened Grip On The Division Championship

Hawley Performs Well In Opening Game; Uth Threatens In Second, Winning Margin Small

The Aggies tightened their grasp on first place in the Western basketball division by decisively triumphing in the University basketball game in a two game series last Friday and Saturday. The first game was taken with a 56-26 score and the second with a 32-23 score.

The Utes appeared to be ready for the first game and Romney's blue fire tempered with the victory in easy style. Undaunted by the defeat of the first night, the Crimsonites came back for a second game with a determination that did everything but take a victory. In the first half during the contest did the Aggies have a safe margin to lead with.

At the half the lead was 12-6. In the second half the Aggies led 12-6. In the last period they were able to slightly widen this gap.
