But very few good stiff workouts have been held to date with the result that few are in condition to display their talents to the best advantage. The track and field have received quite a little attention from Coach Hume, but again the weather is the all important factor. However, a new track may slow the men in their races against time but the competition will be just as close.

One man of the three medal winners of last year's meet is back, all for the white, Mortenson, who placed the gold medal of the three given by Mr. Bert Gordon, but will not after another this spring. Anderson and Croft winners of the silver and bronze medals are not at school. Mortenson is a premier man for the hurdles taking part in the sprints and javelin. In the present kitbop he appears capable of repeating in the hurdles won last year.

There are several men of diversified ability that will question Mortenson's supremacy next Saturday. However, there is the new lot of 1926 men that rank at the top in the spring sports. Webster is the best pole vaulter in the state. He will also bid high for honors in the broad jump, sprints and some field events. They are both exceptional men in their class. Another of the same class is Knowles, a powerful man in the weights.
