USHE 402 Policy Draft – Harrison Kleiner

Looking for feedback from the EPC committee on USHE Policy 402. The new 402 policy now has more open-ended language and the old AAS gen ed categories of communication, computation, and human relations are being retired. This is an opportunity for USU to stack degrees. Applied degrees help students with specific skills for industries. We are proposing a process with a minimum of 9 credits of gen ed and then, depending on the industry needs, additional GE requirement beyond that.
