COACHES FEEL AGGIES IN TOMORROW'S GAME

Utah Has Won Two, Aggies One, One Tied—Teams Tied in Last Ten Years Played — Utah Picked by Wide Margin

Over a period of ten years the Aggies and Utah have tied in a number of games won, each school holds four victories over the other and two have been tied. However since the coming of the Armstrong Utah in 1925 the Aggies have not fared as well. Utah having won six out of ten and Utah has been picked by wide margin.

The Aggies pick Utah to win by at least three touchdowns again this year and the two teams season record against common opponents would indicate a score however on more than one occasion the fighting Aggies have upset the Utah team and brought home the bacon when they were conceded no chance of winning. The wide Aggie coach Dick Romney always has several "fast" ones in the annual Turkey game and although Utah is winning and waiting for these "fast" ones to usually make the difference in an entirely unexpected tie with the result that they may be expected from either coach.

We hope that the game next Thursday will place Dick and Ike on equal terms again. In the first meeting between them and Dick the Utah 10-6.

An inside kick was successful, the Aggies then punted out of bounds on the three yard line, scored possession of the ball on a partially blocked punt and converted over for a touchdown before Utah knew the game had started. Later Romney's kick added a field goal. The remarkable generalship of Coach Leach, aided at quarterback was one of the particularly bright spots in the game. Warren Hawley starred with his great defensive play at full back. The Utah star, Robert, fought stubbornly for a victory and counted two long drop kicks from the field, the game ended 10-6.

The 1926 game was nothing but a fiasco, the only one in the ten year period. The Aggies were comparatively weak and they had no offensive play in the early game. The result was a humiliating victory for Utah with Howells and Dow dominating the attack. Before the game finished the score was 34-0.

Romney's boys were fighting badly by coming right back in 1927 and against practically the same team, but they were out with a 0-6 tie. It was one of the greatest, down right battles ever fought against great odds on Utah field. The game was remarkably fast last year. Utah lost another great team and the Utes scored a 20-0 victory. It was a game for all that. The Aggies were in scoring territory during a good share of the afternoon, twice on the one yard line, but the final pass was lacking and the two teams were tied 0-0 as far as Romney's coaching days are concerned.

Previous to this last decade the Aggie opposition dated back to 1902 and 1903. Three victories went to the Aggies between 1902 and 1912. The winning years were 1903 when the Aggies beat Utah 14-0, a 17-0 drubbing, 1913 when they lost 14-0 to Utah, and 1914 when Peterson in the starring role, and Coach Jack Watson was directing the Farmers.

After the Aggie grid team went through the season without a defeat ending up a 1-4 year with a 14-0 win over Utah.
