Montana State on Top

Utah and Montana State sat this week while the Aggies and Cougars tangle in the Garden City. The pennant chase has taken on all the aspects of a foot and toe ball struggle to the finish line, and the series in Provo this week end will be a crucial one not only for the two teams in competition but for the entire western division. The Montana State Bobcats are back in the northern half of the division. Two early season victories over Valdez Peterson's Redskins, and a split in the Aggie series gives them a record of 3 won and one lost. The Aggies and Cougars are tied for second with a win and a loss apiece, and 3 defeats. However, Utah has only just found itself as was shown by herding the Aggies against B. Y. U., and that school is not to be counted out yet by any means.

All-Conference Material

The only interesting thing about the Montana State series, was the way George Young, rangy Aggie guard split the strings in that first contest. Five times in the first half, he was, nonchalantly tossed the sphere in the hoop, and then as a bow, after a minute in his short appearance in the second contest, Buzzetti covered Young like a carper in the second game, and that may or may not be one of the reasons for the poor showing made by the Aggies on Saturday night.

Campbell also played a marvelous defensive game in that first tilt. The highly touted Buzzetti was not able to garner a single field goal thru the sturdy defense line, and the Aggie captain, Keith Afro, and Bredon Bobcat defense men, likewise played a fine guarding game, and these four men appear to have the inside track on the western division mythical election, as both the Utes and Cougars have inexperienced guards who have not, as yet been tested under fire.
