Candidates for President

Jay Beazer

Jay Beazer who is candidate for office of studentbody president graduated from Davis high school at Kaysville. His hometown is Layton.

He served in the navy during World War II and has also fulfilled a two-year mission for the LDS church in the Northern states mission. He attended Weber college in Ogden for a year.

At Utah State, Beazer has been organizing chairman for the tool engineers' club and president of the club. He is also president of Sigma Tau, honorary engineering fraternity, and co-chairman of the agenda committee for the leadership workshop.

Beazer has been recipient of the American Society of Tool Engineers' scholarship for this year. He is a member of ASTE.

Gary Richardson

Gary Richardson is again seeking the office of studentbody president. Last year, Richardson was a candidate for the office, but was edged out in the primary balloting.

He, however, was elected senior class president, a position which has entitled him to sit as an appointive member of the student council. Next year, he plans to do graduate work.

He is a member of Blue Key honorary fraternity, and is affiliated with Sigma Alpha Epsilon social fraternity.

Last fall, he served as chairman of the harvest ball, and while a junior, was on the junior prom committee.

The recipient of Borden's \$300 scholarship, he holds the top grades in the field of dairying at the college. He represented Utah as the Danforth summer fellowship winner last summer, and toured the midwest.

Gary has participated in drama and musical productions at the college, and is president of the Meistersingers, men's choral group.

Burton Howard

Burton Howard, current president of the Junior class, is seeking the studentbody presidency of Utah State.

A member of Pi Kappa Alpha fraternity, Burt served as student body president of Powell, Wyo., high school.

In high school, he was band captain, worked on the yearbook and school paper, was on the junior prom committee, and participated in junior and senior plays.

At Utah State, he is a member Blue Key honorary fraternity, is a member of Alpha Eta Mu, music fraternity, and of Lambda Delta Sigma.

As Junior class president he worked on this year's junior prom which featured Ralph Flanagan's orchestra. He is currently on the Agathon band committee, is on the Institute MIA staff, and has been president of the Institute choir.

As president of the junior class, he has met with the student council in their weekly meetings.

Other activities include a two-year Buzzer personality, member of the 1952 Homecoming committee, and a member of this year's Military Ball committee.

A vice-presidential candidate is June Lacey, member of Kappa Delta sorority.

A graduate of Tooele high school, Miss Lacey served as president of a school booster organization. She was junior prom chairman, senior class assembly chairman, and was active in music affairs.

Upon graduation, she was awarded a scholarship to Utah State. As a freshman, she was on Student Life Staff, and was active in music activities.

Last year she was appointed to the socials committee and served on a few minor committees.

This year, she is junior class vice president, secretary of Chansonnets, ladies chorus, Buzzer section editor, MIA executive council member at the Institute, on the Preference ball committee, and the KD membership chairman. She was elected a Buzzer personality for the second year.

Margaret Greaves

Margaret Greaves, candidate for studentbody vice president, is from Richfield. She graduated from Cedar City high school in 1953. Her high school activities included Thespians, senior hop chairman, "girl of the year," pep club officer, and representative to Girls' State in 1949.

Miss Greaves is a junior majoring in English and French. She has been active on many committees and organizations at Utah State, including section editor for

Buzzer, Student Life staff, KVSC, and Agathon dance committee.

An active member of Sigma Kappa, Miss Greaves has been social chairman and was recently elected activity manager. She has been on orientation and Preference ball committees for AWS.

Miss Coray, who has been active in Sigma Kappa, also serving as the sorority secretary, is a sophomore this year in the school of commerce.

She is secretary of Alpha Lambda Delta, honorary freshman unit for girls, which has just been established. On the Career Conference committee, Dianne served as secretary.

She is a graduate of Payson high school, where she was active in school affairs, and served as president of the pep club.

Students to Vote On IBM Cards; Results in 'LIFE'

The primary election for studentbody officers for next year will be held tomorrow in the Union Building ballroom. Polls will be open from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

The primary election will be the "weeding out" process for the candidates for the offices of studentbody president, vice president, secretary, three-year councilman, two-year councilman for unexpired term, one-year councilman for unexpired term, and one-year councilman from each of the seven schools.

In this edition, STUDENT LIFE presents brief information about each candidate. Some of the candidates failed to turn in information to be included in this issue, although the editors of STUDENT LIFE attempted to contact each candidate for biographical material.

Results Thursday

STUDENT LIFE will also carry results of the election in Thursday morning's paper.

Students will vote on IBM cards this year, which will speed up the proceeds of tabulating the votes considerably. The elections committee has set up a list of rules which voters are urged to observe closely so that their ballots will not be disqualified or nullified.

IBM Voting Rules

The following rules for voting on the IBM cards will also be posted at the polls:

1. Use the IBM pencil in the booth.
2. Vote by filling in the numbered space directly to the right of your candidates' name with the IBM pencil.
3. Vote for only one candidate for each office.
4. If you make a mistake and cannot erase adequately, return the ballot for another. Any ballot which is marked improperly may cause your vote to be disqualified and may nullify the entire ballot.
5. If you desire to write in a name, mark the space beside the blank line and write in the name of your candidate.
6. The last column is for the candidate who will represent your school. Names of the candidates and their corresponding numbers are listed below. Match the name with the number and fill in the space in the last column on the card.

Studentbody Cards

All students are eligible to vote on president, vice president, one-year unexpired councilman, two-year unexpired councilman and three-year councilman. One-year council candidates will be voted on by the schools only.

Students must present their studentbody cards before they will be given a ballot.

Nora B. Thurgood is chairman of the election board. Members of the board are Jim Slack, Janice Burton, Iris Godfrey and Fran Shoup.

Campaign material for the primary elections must be removed from the halls by 9 a.m. Thursday, Miss Thurgood said.

Phil Sorenson

A candidate for studentbody president is Philip Sorenson, a member of Sigma Chi fraternity.

Phil has served as a member of student council this year, in charge of special events. He is a graduate of Logan high school.

While a freshman, he was a KVSC staff announcer, and had roles in three college drama productions.

Last year, he was appointed to the council to fill an unexpired term, and was placed in charge of awards. He was assistant manager of KVSC, participated in drama and forensic work, received an "A" award medal, and was elected to Blue Key.

A junior this year, he is employed at station KVVU as an announcer and sports director. He worked this year on junior prom publicity, and participated in summer drama activities. He also has also worked on the Scribble staff.

Clifford Fawcett

A former studentbody president of Weber high school is seeking the unexpired one-year term on the student council. He is Ross Allen, a member of Pi Kappa fraternity.

While in high school, Ross was treasurer and then president of the studentbody, and served as president of the Region One student body officers association.

At Utah State, he has been vice president of the PiKappa pledge class, rush chairman, and chairman of finance. Currently, he is chairman of the high school relations division of Agathon.

Charles Tate

Charles Tate, a graduate of Logan high school, and a returned missionary of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, is a candidate for the one-year unexpired term.

Tate graduated from Logan high in 1947 and attended USAC in 1947 and 1948, when he was called on the mission.

He re-entered school at the fall quarter of 1951, and is majoring in English-Speech.

He is a member of Delta Phi. In this organization, he is assemblies chairman, and in charge of banquets and formals. He is assistant business manager of Utah State Theatre, has done work in radio and drama, and is currently in the Shakespearean play.

Two-Year Councilman Mark Blackham

Mark Blackham, candidate for two-year unexpired councilman post, is from McGill, Nevada. He was elected to student council in high school four consecutive years, and was vice president of the senior class.

In college he has been an officer in Alpha Kappa Psi business fraternity. He is the newly-elected rush chairman for Sigma Nu.

Norman Olsen

The unexpired two-year term on the council is being sought by Norman W. Olsen of Brigham City, and a member of Pi Kappa Alpha.

A graduate of Box Elder high school, he served there as vepmaster, president of the boys' pep club, president of the business club, and was active in the speech department.

Olsen received several awards in dramatics and speech while at Box Elder. A sophomore this year at Utah State, he is majoring in business administration.

He has worked on the homecoming committee, and currently is assistant chairman of Agathon. He represents Pi Kappa Alpha on the Interfraternity council.

Three-Year Councilman Brent Hoggan

This year's freshman class president who won that office by a write-in vote, is a candidate for the three-year student council position.

Brent Hoggan, pledge of Pi Kappa Alpha fraternity, and president of his pledge class, is the candidate.

As president of the freshman class, he has met this year with the student council, as an appointive member.

A graduate of Weber high school, he was studentbody president there. He was chosen by school principals of the region as the outstanding student of the region in 1952.

He was named winner of the Elks Club outstanding leader con-

test in Utah for 1952.

In addition to his freshman presidency, he is chairman of the advertising committee of the Leadership workshop.

Ken Woodward

Ken Woodward, a freshman from Logan, is a candidate for the three-year council position.

Ken, a member of Delta Phi fraternity, was a candidate this year for the freshman class presidency. He has fulfilled a mission in the North Central States for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

Active athletically, he is on the tennis team and the track team.

He graduated from Logan high school, where he was junior class president. A veteran, he served for two years in the Army Engineer corps, filling his tour of duty in the South Pacific, Japan, and the Philippines.

Glen Haddock

Glen Haddock is vying for the three-year position on the student council.

Haddock, a freshman, this year has served as president of the Independent Students Association.

A graduate of Logan high school, he was active in school affairs. He carried the lead in drama productions, participated in opera, was a rifle team member, a member of the ROTC officers club, and was on the school baseball and swimming teams.

In his first year at Utah State, in addition to the ISA presidency, he has been assistant advertising manager of the Buzzer, circulation manager of Student Life, member of the president's club, a member of Lambda Delta Sigma, was a candidate for the Freshman class presidency, and is a member of Meistersingers.

Jim Cole

In quest of the three-year council position, Jim Cole, a freshman majoring in journalism, has a competent student activity background.

A graduate of Logan high school, Cole was active in school publications, class committees, student body assignments and athletics.

He is employed as sports editor of the Herald Journal, being closely associated with Utah State's athletic program.

Cole is an active member of the Sigma Chi fraternity.

Agriculture Don Bybee

Seeking the one-year council position from Agriculture is Don L. Bybee, native of Soda Springs, Idaho.

Bybee, in high school, starred in several plays, was in varsity football and baseball, attended Idaho Boy's State, and won the Bausch and Lomb honorary science award. He also played in the band.

At Utah State, he majored in engineering his first year, and then changed to General Agronomy.

An active member of Lambda Delta Sigma, he served as reporter, historian, Gamma chapter president, Homecoming chairman for the fraternity, designer and builder of a sweepstakes-winning homecoming float, spring formal chairman, and as executive vice president.

He also has done publicity for the 4-H club at the college, and is a member of the square dance club.

He played a minor role in "Death of a Salesman" and has been on the rifle team two years ago. He served on the junior prom committee, and as chairman of the Campus Chest dance.

He's student manager of the union building cloakroom, is on the club services committee, the socials committee, and the union program board.

Douglas Huber

Seeking the one-year council post from Agriculture is Douglas Huber, a junior from Midway.

Majoring in dairy manufactur-

ing, Huber is a member of the dairy club.

He is a graduate of Wasatch high school, and while in high school served as vice president and secretary of the FFA chapter.

At Utah State, he is a member of the Ag club, and the Sears Roebuck scholarship club. He is affiliated with Pi Kappa Alpha fraternity, and is an officer on the regimental staff of the Pershing Rifles.

He was on the dairy products judging team entered at the Pacific International Livestock Exposition at Portland, Ore., and is a committee member representing the dairy department on the School of Agriculture Agathon committee.

A candidate from the school of arts and sciences for the one-year council position is Ruth Green, a member of Chi Omega sorority.

Miss Green has served on the junior prom committee, as a proofreader on Student Life, and has played a role in "The Corn Is Green."

She also was chairman of the AWS, "Little-Sister" activity during Freshman orientation week.

She is a graduate of Logan high school.

Larry Haslam

Competing for the one-year council position from the school of arts and sciences is Larry Haslam, a member of Pi Kappa Alpha fraternity.

A graduate of North Cache high school in 1951, Larry was a student councilman there, and runner-up for studentbody president. He represented North Cache at the State Rotary club meet, also.

At Utah State, where he is majoring in pre-dentistry, he has been active in Pi Kappa Alpha, serving as pledge president, and song leader.

Last year, he was a member of the Utah State male Trio, which consisted of Lee Cantwell, Dick Lewis, and himself.

James Mortimer

James Mortimer, editor of Student Life, is a candidate for the one-year council position from the school of arts and sciences.

Mortimer, a junior journalism major, has served as editor of the campus paper for a year and two quarters. Prior to that, he was managing editor.

In addition to his Student Life work, he has done publicity for several organizations and activities.

He is a member of Blue Key, honorary upperclass fraternity, and of Scabbard and Blade, military honorary fraternity.

Also, he is national editor of the Lambda Delta Sigma newspaper. For the past two summers, he has been editor of summer school Student Life.

Last week he was named winner of the annual Deseret News-Telegram internship.

Commerce Preston Thomas

Preston Thomas, candidate for councilman from the school of commerce, is a junior majoring in political science. He is a native of Logan.

Among his activities at USAC are these: president of Intrafraternity council, member of the union building board of directors, Scribble staff, Clivie Music Board, Pi Sigma Alpha, and Sigma Chi. Thomas was studentbody president at Logan high school and he placed first in the state for-

ensic meet in debate in 1950.

Sydney Nelson

A candidate from the school of commerce, Sydney Nelson is a freshman this year. She graduated from Logan high school, where she was in the upper ten percent of her class in scholarship. At high school she placed second in the Northwestern States' speech tournament. She was also Senior Hits act chairman.

A graduate of Logan high, Miss Linford was recipient of the Mariner S. Eccles scholarship and has been publicity chairman of the Union program board. She has also been on the socials committee.

She was vice president of the girls league at high school. Her other activities included associate editor of the yearbook, debating, Senior Hits chairman, member of swimming team, and honor student.

Education John Angotti

John Angotti, candidate for councilman from the school of education, attended Carbon junior college at Price, his hometown. At Carbon, he was editor of the student directory and business manager of the yearbook.

At USAC he has been a member of the business staff of Buzzer. He is an active member of Sigma Phi Epsilon fraternity, and he has served as secretary; at present he is second vice president and editor of the fraternity "newsletter". He has also been secretary of the Newman club.

Mary Davis

Mary Davis, who is competing for council position from the school of education, was secretary of her high school. She is a native of Venice, Utah.

At Utah State, Miss Davis has been a member of the Booster committee, ROTC Sponsor, Junior Prom chairman, treasurer of Kappa Delta sorority.

She is presently serving as one-year councilman from the school of education. She was elected to the position six weeks ago.

Nedra Nielson

Background material on Nedra Nielson, candidate for Commerce councilman, was not available at press time. It was not turned in with her application.

Engineering Jerry Christiansen

Jerald N. Christiansen is a candidate for one year councilman from the school of engineering.
