The women's center provides several services to women that come including case management, individual therapy, and group therapy. The center is in direct contact with services around that will be able to provide housing and childcare to those who need it as well. The women that come in to the space need to feel welcome, comfortable, and relaxed as soon as they step foot in the building. In order to complete that feeling, I based my research on materials and colors that will provide comfort. Based on that reseach, people tend to feel the most relaxed to lighter and more chromatic colors but in the range of 6,000 and 10,000K, cooler hues. For materials, I focused on having natural elements such as wood but also having lots of texture to add depth and more visual interest.



Included in this center is a clinic that provides outpatient services to women that is run by women, allowing any patients to feel comfortable coming here, no matter their needs. This center is designed based off the same color research done on the rest of the building, finding that the colors most associated with joy are bright, light, and chromatic in the range of 1,000 and 5,000K, meaning warmer hues. The design of the clinic involves the same natural wood tones but adds yellow hues to bring more joy to all the patients.
