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## Normative Interventions

Normative Interventions focus on behaviors individuals with autism may express and how to change them

**Video Modeling-** Videos modeling correct verbal responses to conversation topics

**Self-Management-** Tracking each time an individual speaks

**Social Stories-** Stories to teach individuals others perspective

## Individuals with Autism's perspective

Individuals with autism want to have help learning how to set boundaries, gain confidence and self-assurance. They like who they are and do not want to change, just to learn skills to better manage in our world

## Parents of Children with Autism's Perspective

Parents want the best for their child, for them to be confident, capable, functional members of society. They see a lot of the behaviors as disruptive, which is why they focus on normative interventions that address only the behaviors

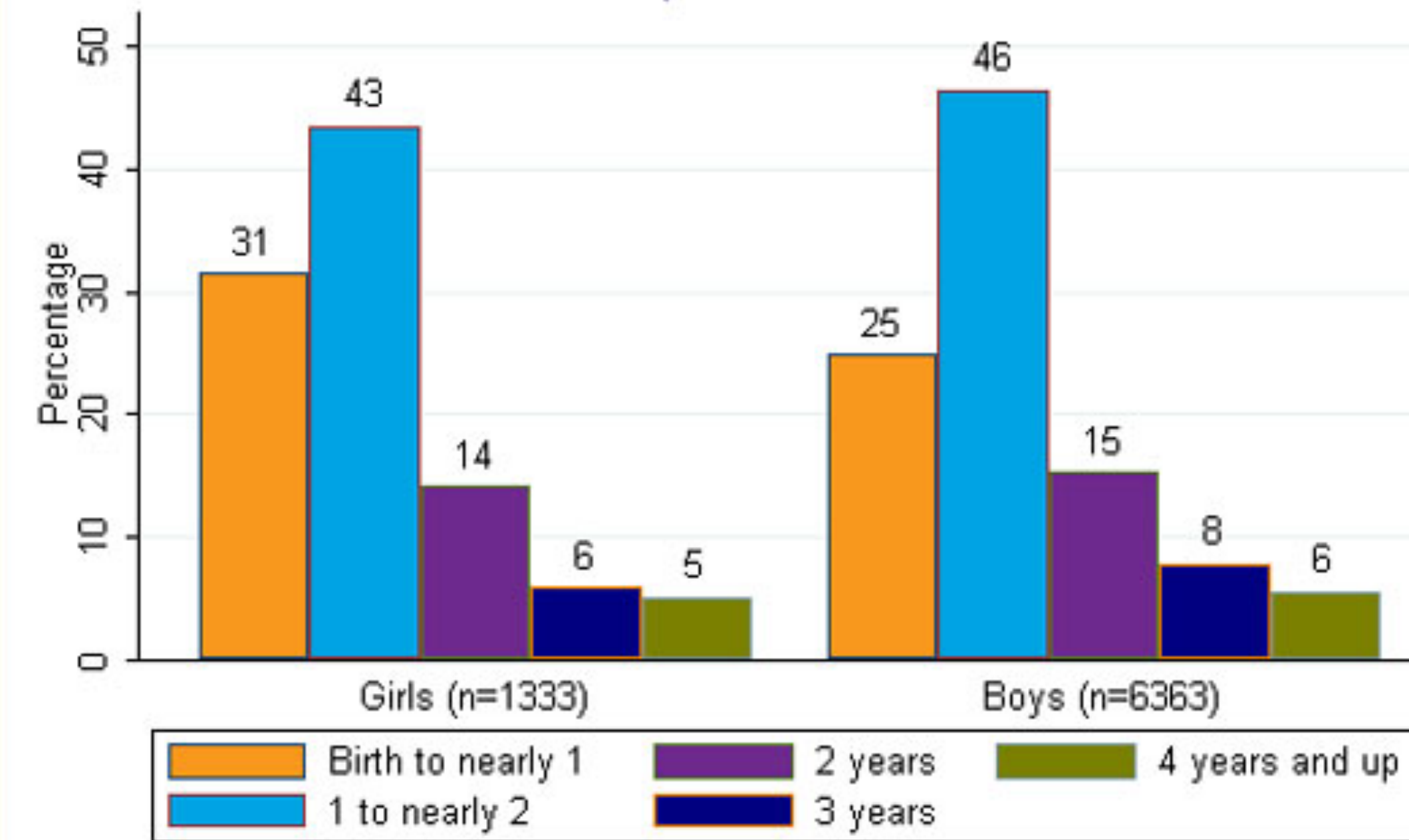


**BOYS** are 4X more likely to be diagnosed than **GIRLS**

## Better Interventions to Consider

- When looking at interventions for individuals with autism, we need to look at ways to boost their self-confidence and provide the information they need to cope in the world.
- Teaching them better coping skills, and how to set boundaries

- Group therapy tends to help newly diagnosed autistic individuals meet others with similar issues, and learn that they are not alone in dealing with these difficulties.
- Minecraft servers that are heavily monitored, invite only has been another helpful intervention. One such server provided a safe community for individuals with autism of all ages to interact with each other, eventually encouraging non-verbal individuals to speak
