EXPERIENCE BEYOND TRAVEL

THERE ARE OVER 1.4 BILLION **TOURISTS ARRIVE AT THEIR DESTINATIONS EVERY YEAR.** THAT'S 45 ARRIVALS EVERY SINGLE SECOND. IN 1950, **THERE WERE 25 MILLION IN-**TERNATIONAL TOURIST AR-RIVALS. IN 1970, THE **NUMBER WAS 166 MILLION,** AND BY 1990, IT HAD GROWN *TO 435 MILLION. FROM 1990* TO 2018, NUMBERS MORE THAN TRIPLED REACHING 1.442 BILLION. BY 2030, 1.8 **BILLION TOURIST ARRIVALS** ARE PROJECTED.

NEGATIVE ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACTS OF TOURISM INCLUDE DE-PLETION OF LOCAL NATURAL RESOURCES AS WELL AS POLLU-TION AND WASTE PROBLEMS. TOURISM PUTS PRESSURE ON NATURAL RESOURCES THROUGH OVER-CONSUMPTION, OFTEN IN PLACES WHERE RESOURCES ARE ALREADY SCARCE. THIS PUTS STRESS ON LOCAL LAND USE AND CAN LEAD TO SOIL ERO-SION, INCREASED POLLUTION, NATURAL HABITTAT LOSS, AND MORE PRESSURE ON ENDANGERED SPECIES.








TOURISTS BY 2030
