For the better part of two seasons Coach Walker has been an important member of our College community. Although very much less in evidence in the daily school routine than most members of the faculty, from his first appearance he, without conscious effort, won and kept possession of the heart of every A. C. [Agricultural College] student. Nor was this conquest by any means due entirely to the popularity and fascination of his line of work. It was due far more to the personal qualities of the man. Mr. Walker possesses the quiet but irresistible fascination of the perfect gentleman, the manly man without vices. Retiring, almost taciturn, in disposition, he did not win his universal popularity among the Student Body, in particular the athletes, by flashing, brilliant talk or social graces. It was achieved by sheer force of lofty character and noble ideals, always sure to command respect, especially when found in connection with such magnetism of personality as in Coach Walker's case.

That the students appreciated the unusual excellence of Mr. Walker's character, and were sensible at the loss the institution sustains by his leaving, was graphically shown by the farewell reception tendered him in the College Library, Wednesday afternoon, November 25.

The reception was arranged by the officers of the Student Body Association, and consisted of a short program followed by informal chat,

handshakes, and refreshments. Mr. A. E. Stratford and Miss L. Maughan, with the orchestra, furnished musical selections. Brief speeches were given by President Widtsoe, Professors Laughton and Caine of the athletic committee, and Captain Brossard of the Eleven. All spoke earnestly and emphatically of Mr. Walker's work in raising the standard of honesty in athletics, of his moral integrity, of his high ideals, and of his fidelity in friendship. All expressed the universal feeling of profound regret at his departure and wished him success and God-speed in his future career. Captain Brossard, on behalf of the students, presented the Coach with a large A. C. U. [Agricultural College of Utah] banner with his name and the years of his service as Director of Athletics, in white letters.

Mr. Walker was deeply moved by these expressions of friendship and

appreciation. He gave a short response full of feeling, telling how, almost against his expectation, he had become deeply attached to the A. C. U. [Agricultural College of Utah], and assuring the students that no one would be more elated at any A. C. U. [Agricultural College of Utah] victory in athletics than our former Coach.

Mr. Walker has gone to enter the Law School of the University of Chicago. The best wishes of Student Life accompany him. May he be most eminently successful, and may his influence ever linger with us of the A. C. U. [Agricultural College of Utah]
